Pastor's Page

It has been long said that “*absence makes the heart grow fonder*”. Since the snow season has begun, I think we have realized that in a different way. It is really nice that we have the ability to live stream the service, when there are just a few folks here and most are more safe and comfortable worshipping at home. It is likewise nice that I live close to the Church, 200’ the last time I checked, and can do a “Fireside Chat” if it is so bad that we decide to simply close. These things are very convenient, and more and more folks feel comfortable availing themselves of the technology. But we have had to do this enough in the past month or so to realize how nice it is and how much we enjoy simply being together.

The “community” in Community Presbyterian Church of Chester (CPCC or more commonly simply CPC) has long meant to me that we are present and active in our local community, and that is certainly true. It is nice being the big church on Main Street with the defining red doors so that we are visible. More importantly, this congregation has always been a bright spot in our little town. One of the things that attracted me here nearly 20 years ago was how frequently the parking lot was busy. The CPC campus provides peace to so many community groups: several scouting groups, recovery groups, the Chester 50 + Club, a quilting/sewing group, and more, as well as our own internal groups. It is a busy place for community life.

But back to the absence part. We know how meaningful worship in person is for those who can make it regularly; the sounds of the music, the interaction during prayer time, and the connection I enjoy with all of you during the sermon. Whether you are worshipping in person or online, it is always nice to hear what has been meaningful to you during the service. Some people, especially when worshipping online and you have the ability to pause, send me details (sometimes very detailed) questions about certain aspects of the sermon. This leads to discussion and connection, and connection is what community life in a church is all about.

I’m not sure what the groundhog saw today, and I’m fairly sure that it makes no difference. I know that winter is still here and does not seem to be going anywhere soon, but I am grateful for all of you who make up this community. I am glad we can worship together almost no matter what the weather and that our community can live and thrive in such conditions; but it is always nice when we can see each other and continue to build those bonds.

And those are my simple early February reflections as my weather app tells me it is 22 degrees Fahrenheit out and the snow and ice don’t seem to be going anywhere soon. I’m very glad to be here and have these times of community with all of you.

- Don’t forget to order Scrip cards on or before the second Sunday of the month.

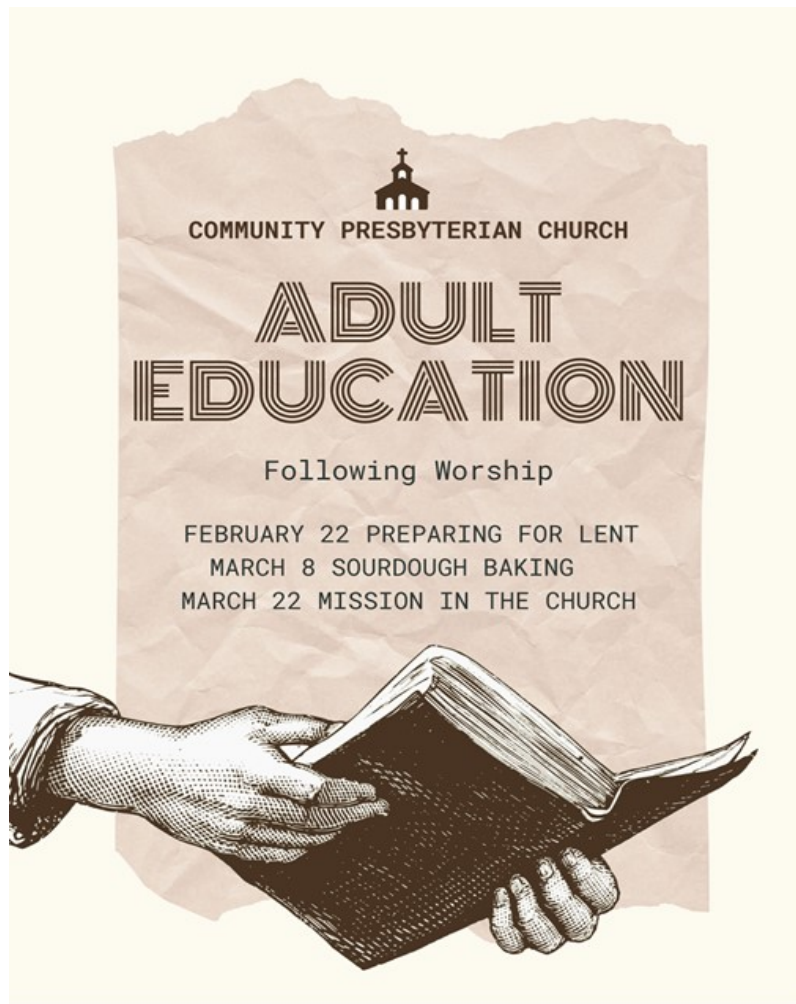

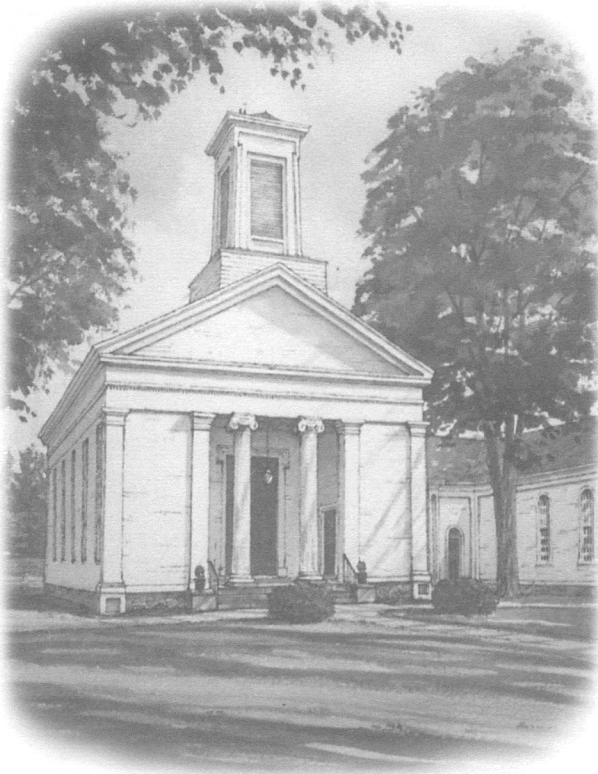
