#### The Road to Bethlehem

A Journey to the Newborn King

The music department is gearing up for our Christmas Cantata on December 18th. Guest Musicians will include: on Trumpet, Chris Arnold; Percussion, Stephen O'Toole; Clarinet/Tenor Saxophone: Ed Goellner; our very own Andy Smith on Trombone and Matt McConnell on Trumpet/French Horn. The Adult Bell Choir is also ringing that day for the Prelude which will start off the wonderful service.

The Cantata this year is called "The Road to Bethlehem". Bethlehem seemed an unlikely destination for the fulfillment of God's promise to send a Messiah. Bethlehem? Why would anyone--especially the Creator of the universe--choose that little remote village? Nothing good came from there! There was nothing distinctive or glamorous about this common town. But as Scripture records, the road to Bethlehem was the road that ultimately led to God!

Mary and Joseph took that road. The shepherds and the Magi did as well. And now we have been invited to take that journey; to experience in fresh and powerful ways the eternal hope that lies waiting for us in the form of a newborn Baby. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you: He is Christ the Lord. (Luke 2:11)


