## A Thank you from Fisherman's Mark, Social Services

Thank you for your recent donation of gift cards totaling the amount of \$1,100.00 in support of Hurricane Ida relief. New Orleans had Katrina. The Jersey Shore had Sandy. And our little community of Lambertville had Ida. The scale might be smaller, but the devastation to the individuals affected was no less traumatizing. One of the many families displaced by Hurricane Ida came to us with only the clothes on their backs ~ the mother didn't even have her shoes. They lost everything they owned in the flood.

The water may have receded but the damage is done and rebuilding the lives of those who had to flee (or in some cases swim) from their homes is going to take time, compassion, and most of all, resources.

Despite the fact that we had our own loss (in case you haven't heard, the Hibernia Fire House, Fisherman's Mark's home since 2017, flooded as well), we continue to do the work of strengthening the community, being true to our tagline: help when help is needed. And help is needed now more than ever. With families still recovering from financial loss during the pandemic and the hurricane piling on to this loss, the services we provide help get our clients back on their feet. As a start, we have secured housing, provided food assistance, social services and childcare for some of these clients. Be we have more work to do.

Your kindness, thoughtfulness and compassion have made a difference. Your donation during this difficult time has been life-sustaining for so many of our clients.

I cannot thank you enough for your generosity. It will take some time but we will get these wonderful families back on their feet.


