Pastors Pages

Well, this year started off strangely, but certainly ended delightfully normal with regards to life here at CPC. Christmas 2021, which seems so long ago, felt like we had the proverbial rug pulled from beneath our feet. Things seemed to be going better and then Omicron hit. That was a big collective “Ugh!”

It is amazing how far we have come during this past year. You’ll notice I used the expression “normal” in that first paragraph. I don’t especially like that term, especially when it has so often been applied these past few years, to the past tense, as in, “get back to normal”. God gives us one direction to move and that is forward. I also like the quote from Ivern Ball that, “*The past should be a springboard, not a hammock.*” (as much as I like some time in a hammock).

I have to say that this has been a pretty amazing year given the ground we have covered as a congregation. Congregation life is always filled with ups and downs, triumphs and tragedies, sorrow and incredible joy, all in living through what God has given us.

There was much talk of the excellent “vibe” going around the Church, and I think that came from the excitement of simply being able to do things again; things we love so dearly. But also I think it has a lot to do with the WAY in which we did things. This past year and before have been good times for us to evaluate what we do and how we do it. I think we have shaken off aspects of things that just created more work with little return, and moved forward with a simplicity and even purity that allows us to preserve all of the best parts of the various things we do here without all of the extra work. Some might describe that as efficiency or good stewardship of resources. I would certainly not argue those characterizations, but I think there is more to it. We have discovered what we really love to do, what is really important to us, and the rest has simply fallen away. This, combined with our enthusiasm that “things will be alright” and “yes, we can” have really given us a boost of energies that we have been missing for awhile, and that is a very good thing.
