Ahh June, the doorstep to our summer season at Community Presbyterian Church. There is a lot to celebrate in June: the ending of Eastertide with Pentecost Sunday on June 9, when we will welcome new members joining the congregation; All Church Sunday on the same day when we celebrate the end of our Sunday School year; a day of celebrating Emily's ministry with us as Family Ministries Director and also welcoming Deacon Melissa Ash to that position; Father's Day June 16th when we will also welcome our Confirmation Class as full members and three of them will be Baptized!

While all of this has been going on, preparations have continued in earnest for the Bluegrass Festival on July 6th; the ASP work camp trip July 13th; the Peach Festival August 3rd, and Vacation Bible School starting August 12th. Whew!

From Your Management Council, May, 2019

The Iglesia Pentecostés Senda Antigua (IPSA) has been meeting in Plainfield the last few years. They are interested in the Chester area since some of their members are from this area. They have been looking for a Chester location for over a year. They expect to start the new congregation with 10-15 local members. We have offered to host their services. They would meet in our sanctuary, the kitchen and Fellowship Center on Sundays from about 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm. and they will clean up. They will use the keyboard. There will be occasional meetings at other times, according to calendar and space availability. We will have a rent-free lease for twelve months and then revisit how the congregation has grown and how the arrangement is working to meet their needs. They will make donations to CPC from their offering. The lease agreement is being reviewed by the Newton Presbytery Board of Trustees.

Tommy Dombroski, Eagle Scout candidate, of BSA Troop 139, chose CPC to be the benefactors of his Eagle Scout project. The results greatly improve the safety of accessing the sanctuary attic and tower bell ringing platform. The rebuilt steps, the protective cover for the A/C ducts, the new railings, and barriers are first quality and will serve for decades to come.

The Chester Shade Trees Commission offered to plant shade trees in the space between the parking lot and Church Street. It was judged that it is not a good location. The soil is thin, and the earlier trees there did not last long. There may be another location later.

Tommy Tree Experts will trim the cherry tree at the manse, cut a tree overhanging the driveway and remove a large dying tree in the front yard. Dick Wynja will cut the dead tree overhanging the rear yard, with permission from the owner.

Two of the six Larison room ceiling lights had failed and more were slow to come on. Crowley Electric replaced all six with LEDs for \$840.

R&R construction serviced all three mowers. Dan and Jerilynn Harris are mowing the grass, Bart Case is taking care of the Memorial garden, and John O'Connor is trimming around the property. Dick Wynja fertilizes the grass, in addition to many other tasks around the church. Dick is nearing completion of the Belgian block curb by the sanctuary; it replaces rotten wooden beams by Fellowship Center and the sanctuary. Dick will repair the Larison steps in June.

The leaking Larison door panels will be checked out when the rain stops. Pastor Chris replaced the Men's room faucet.

Ray Trevisan is borrowing a tent and has arranged with ASP/BYG to set it up and take it down as he has done before.

Kyle Kristiansen, a metal detection hobbyist, had planned to search the property, but was apparently rained out.

We have one estimate for \$5396 for painting the Larison exterior from Bob Lutz of Quality Painting.

The Sanctuary carpet really needs cleaning. Dick knows a candidate cleaner company.

We will work to develop a chore list for volunteers. This could be an hour, morning, afternoon, day, ongoing projects. One example would be painting: rooms, hallways, front column bottoms...
