



From Your Pastor:

Numbers are dropping, things are opening up more and more, spring is just around the corner, and Easter is coming! It seems like lots of things are falling into place just as we are excited to get out and do more things.

Just to reiterate what I have mentioned in worship, that Session has been discussing and wondering about removing more and more restrictions as they have been these past two years. They recently voted to make masking optional for the many groups that use our buildings. Many had returned already and others have come back since.

Worship in the Sanctuary is a bit of a different space and they decided that it would be best to wait just a few weeks more, to continue to watch the numbers and also what happens following the local schools removing the mask requirements early this month, and make a call at the Session meeting on March 15th.

We have a lot going for us on this front: The Sanctuary is large and open with lots of space, which always allows those who would like to keep distance to do so. We also had upgraded the air filtration system to a "hospital grade" HEPA system that turns over the air in the Sanctuary 5-6 time per hour, so in hope, we continue to watch the numbers from various sources and look forward to a confident decision to get back to normal. Did someone say, "coffee hour?"

Sunday School has been meeting all along in one form or another, Confirmation class is meeting regularly again, and we look forward to planning some youth and family activities in the coming months.

We are looking forward to our traditional Easter and Holy Week services as well; the Maundy Thursday last supper and Communion service in Fellowship Center, the Good Friday Tenebrae service in the Sanctuary, the 6:30 Easter Sunrise service at Alstede's Farm, hopefully breakfast back in Fellowship Center, then the 8:30 and 10am Easter services in the Sanctuary! It will be an amazing day to celebrate in a way we have not since 2019.

So have hope, stay safe, protect yourself in the ways and to the degree that is right for you, and most of all keep your eyes on the horizon!

Church. If you would like to join the group, or would like some Information about 'Cultured Purls', please call the office, or come join them for their next meeting.





We are collecting:

- Bicycles: Must have all working functional parts, no flat tires.
- Toys: Soft or Hard Toys, below 14 inches
- Linens: Bedsheets, Blankets, Curtains
- Clothing and Shoes: Men's, Women's, Children's, Infants

Not Acceptable Items:


