## ***From Your Pastor . . .***

Even more than most years, we are looking forward to the unfolding of Spring and Summer here at the Community Presbyterian Church. We are again at the point where we have had some wonderful tastes of the beautiful Spring weather, and then Winter has crept back in a bit again. Does it seem like this has happened more than in a typical Spring? It does to me, but, I think a lot of that has to do with this particular Spring. We can really feel like we are moving into a more manageable space with regards to many things. "Return to normal" seems like such a cliché term, and it really has become that lately, but I don't know if it ever is an especially fitting or accurate wish.

As many of you know, Community Presbyterian is not a congregation that sits back and takes the Summer off. The Summer work camp with the Big Youth Group, the Peach Festival, and Vacation Bible School just to name the big ones.

All of these events are opportunities for us to engage; engage with one another, with various ministry opportunities to the community and beyond and to form, build, and strengthen relationships all along the way.

The author of the First Testament book of Ecclesiastes asks the question, "*What have the workers to gain from their toil?*" (Eccl. 3:9) I think a good answer to that, beyond what might be obvious is, "things that we could never imagine."

God gives us work to do, opportunities to work together around a particular goal or cause or purpose. This is one of the ways in which we engage in the stewardship aspect of our lives as disciples. We are given much and called to use what we are given in the service of God's Kingdom. Luke charges us in his Gospel, "*From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded.*" (Lk 12:48b)

As many know, Peach Festival has undergone a dramatic transformation after the pandemic. It is smaller and more "approachable" while preserving most of what we hope for in a Summer Church festival. This means that those who attend, and have little idea of what goes into the organization, planning, and execution of the event can simply come and have a delightful time. As so often is the case, the "behind the scenes" is not as pretty as the final result. But as a congregational event, every step along the way needs to be regarded as ministry, not just the final product on the day of the event, or the final bottom line financially. This is one of the things that has been recovered for the Peach Festival in it's post-pandemic form.

I can't mention enough how much enthusiasm exists among the Core Team as we have planned the festival last year and are planning for this year. We ran into so many instances of finding the time to enjoy the work and the process and especially the relationships we enjoy along the way in the midst of all of the preparations.

In my opinion this is a huge gain for the Peach Festival and all who make it happen and this is where we want to be.

Being smaller and organized differently, with all of the changes implemented last year, has created this new environment for our congregation to engage in this form of stewardship and receive so much amidst the work. That is a beautiful thing and there is something to do for everyone.



### **How our Scrip Program works:**

When we purchase gift cards, the merchant makes a percentage donation back to the church. There are many, many retail outlets of all types in the Scrip program, but the one most commonly used by CPCers is Shop Rite. There are copies of the list of Participating Retail Stores and scrip order forms available on the table in Fellowship Center. It's a simple process to order:

1. Decide how much you want in a variety of retailer gift cards.
2. Make a check out to *CPC - PW* for that amount. In the memo line, identify that it's for Scrip.
3. Drop the check off in the office (we ask for payment before we order your cards.)
4. The office will email or call you when the gift cards arrive, usually later in the week (Thursdays most times).
5. Pick your cards up (full value of the check you wrote) and use them for gifts, to pay for groceries or for meals if you order restaurant gift cards, for shopping i.e. Kohls, Old Navy etc..


Shop Rite donates 4% of the total gift card purchase to CPC. So, for every \$100. you purchase in Shop Rite gift cards, CPC receives \$4. It's an easy process, it makes shopping easier and it's a great way to contribute to CPC with **NO** out of pocket expense!

**SCRIP NEWS** ~ For April, we had 14 families purchase scrip with a net rebate of \$250.13 for CPC ; our year-to-date net rebate is \$1105.70. Thank you, as always, for your continued support! Barbara Misar won this month's donated \$10 gift card. Congratulations Barbara!! It is never too late to join our happy group of scrip shoppers - the more the merrier! Orders are placed on the second Sunday of the month, but individual orders/payments can be dropped off in the office prior to that if it is more convenient. 
