Sunday School: We are very excited to be back in church for Sunday School. Our classes have been held in the Larison Room which has been working out great since we are able to spread out comfortably. We are half way through our theme, "Fruit of the Spirit" and the children have been learning about the different attributes each week. Our weekly lessons include bible readings, crafts, completing written activities and games. The children also have their own Fruit of the Spirit Canvas Bag which hold their materials and additional activities for them to complete throughout the morning. Depending on their age, some children have a Jesus Activity Book while the younger children have an ABC's of the Bible Writing Book. Together, we are making FootSteps for the children of our future. Each week, the children have also been helping with the organization of the donated food items. As a group, we have discussed the purpose of the food collection and the children are also going to help sort each item. Thank you for your donations and generosity! Youth Group: Our first meeting went well and the children were excited to be together again. We began with an ice-breaker game using M & M's and depending on the color of candy, they had to share something about themselves. (i.e. an **orange** candy: name a thing you do well; **red** candy: something about yesterday; **green** candy: favorite movie, book or food, etc.). The children also played a trivia Tic-Tac-Toe game, Reverse charades and Bible Bowling. After the activities, we had a dinner together which allowed for conversation to continue.

Confirmation Class: We had a very productive first Confirmation Class and began with reintroducing everyone together. Pastor Chris explained to the group the purpose of Confirmation Class as well as the outline for the year. The children shared the various lessons and stories they learned throughout their Sunday School years while Pastor Chris explained the importance of understanding the many different bible stories.
