## From Your Pastor . . .

Autumn is easily my favorite season of the year. The first time the heating comes on in the house, the cool crisp evening air scented with the smell of wood smoke from fireplaces, the beginnings of leaves blushing with color, all herald the changes of the season. I love thinking about sincere pumpkin patches and a possible sighting of the Great Pumpkin. I love our Holiday Extravaganza, Thanksgiving, and then the season of Advent that leads to Christmas.

Autumn, like many seasons, inspires a bit of cleaning out and sorting as we usher in the changes. Going through clothes from the past season as well as unpacking warmer clothes, coats, shoes, boots, to prepare for the coming cooler and then colder weather.


