Pastor's Page

While the summer is still with us, in many ways it is waning as we approach the autumn. Our summer activities are mostly done, both in the Church and in our personal lives, kids are going back to school, the days are shorter and the mornings cooler, and thoughts of the crisp autumn air and changing leaves are closer to reality.

After boxes piled high, shorts and sweaty T-shirts and a creative summer of music, we're back to a cleared out Fellowship Center, re-emerging sweaters, and choir anthems during Worship. The CPC season change is certainly dramatic, but some things just don't change.

We still monitor our income and expenses each month, and we're happy to report that through July, our income was better than budgeted, largely because of special gifts, and our expenses were lower. However, pledges, as is typical in the summer, are lagging and, of course, we thankfully haven't had to pay for snowplowing or heat for a while! Just a reminder --- please keep up with your pledge if at all possible.


