Pastor's page . . .

The Bible is a story of the history of God and God's people. While the stories are set in various times and places, the lessons they provide transcend both of those things, as our histories can easily be rewritten in and among the stories in the Bible. This is by God's design to bring us a sense of comfort and belonging, but also that we are a part of that ongoing history as well. History is important.

Our particular congregation of Christ's church is about to celebrate 275 years in 2027. That is not a lot in terms of big picture history, but for us as individuals and for we as a country, it is a long time.

From the most humble beginnings as members of a British colony worshiping in the crude environment of "God's Barn" on Pleasant Hill, so named because of the light, wind, and cold that penetrated the gaps in the wall boards; to the rebuilding and shifting of the original building, done so that the entrance faced the road and parishioners entered from behind the pulpit to discourage latecomers. To the decision after 100 years of being a congregation to split into three as the local towns had grown enough to each support its own church. History is important.

In 1851, when the congregation split among new congregations to be formed in Flanders, Mount Olive, and Chester, new histories would begin. We are fortunate to have good documented history from our first sermon by the Rev Samuel Harker (who was later removed for heresy) through 1972, a few years before the Rev. Robert Maseroni made way for the Rev. Charlie Ringe, but then the recorded and written history largely ends. It is time for an update.

We are blessed to have many people with many talents and also many with long memories of life here. So with this and the coming Bicenterquasquigenary of our congregation (yes, it is a real word and maybe by 2027 I will learn how to say it), the time is right to update our history.

So if you have stories and memories to share, please begin writing them down. If you are good at compiling information into a narrative, or if you have desktop publishing skills, or a collection of photos from the period, or anything to contribute to this effort, please let me know. My hope is that a group can form, begin to meet, and strategize a timeline for creating a new history to be distributed during our 275th anniversary celebrations in 2027. So if you have ideas and would like to dedicate time, you know where to find me!


