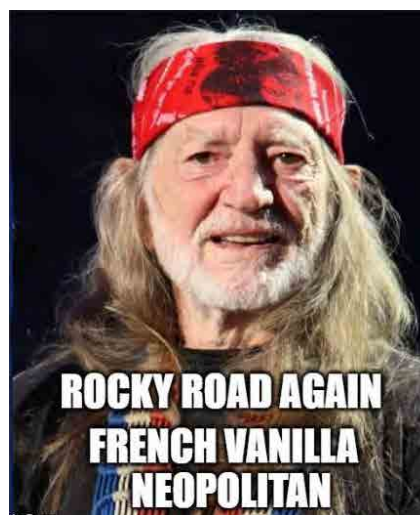

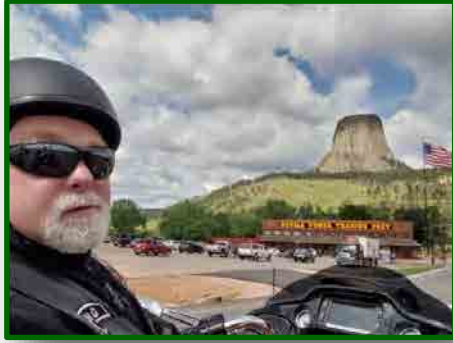

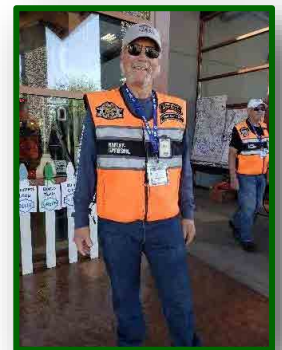


FROM THE DESK OF JOHN G.

I attended the Rockies 2 Pacific event for 2025 in Meridian, ID recently. We began on Tuesday, June 17 in Monroe, WA. Director Jerry led our group over to Clarkston, WA. Our group was Jerry, Bern, Curt, Andy, Dean, Doni, Jim, Kymber, Tom, Rhonda and myself. Doni had her new Tri-Glide and was anxious to become familiar with how it handled on the open road. She did an amazing job. Dean brought along a GoPro to collect some videos of the ride. Film at 11. Kymber took many action photos and videos. You'll find them on Facebook. Nice work Kymber. Jerry became the master of his helmet intercom coordinating with me (John G) as sweep. Thanks Roger and Jo Ann for passing the helmet intercom units on to Jerry and Doni. Andy blended into our group seamlessly. Andy had some great stories of life in Ketchikan and the 31 mile stretch of road that he and Curt ride frequently. They had their bikes shipped from Ketchikan to Seattle and took a flight from Alaska to join us on the ride. Now that's dedication.

Our second day, Wednesday, the group rode from Clarkston to McCall, ID where Jerry's daughter Trisha joined the group. She blended right in. Highway 55 from McCall to Meridian was very scenic with just enough twisties to make it fun. As we rolled into Meridian it was getting a bit warm and traffic was heavy, so we all scattered off to our lodging locations for the R2P event.

On Thursday we all arrived at the R2P High Desert dealership to witness the opening activities of the hosting chapter, Inter-Mountain HOG. Their organization and attention to detail was phenomenal. They have set the bar close to the sky with their efforts. I focused on the ride functions for R2P. Cliff and Mason became my contacts for ride organization and details. See photo of Cliff →



Notice those picket fence signs in the background? Those were their ride staging signs. They also had color coded ribbons and ride rosters for each Road Captain to validate before beginning the guided rides. The guided rides all left from and returned to the dealership no later than 4 pm. Most completed earlier than 4 pm. They decided that none of the rides would include a meal stop, but they all included one or two comfort stops.



I participated in a self-guided ride on Thursday with Bern, Curt and Andy. We did the Lowman Loop over ID-55, Banks/Lowman Rd and ID-21. It was a spectacular ride along the Payette River with twisty turns alongside white-water rapids. Don't miss these roads if you get to the area. On Friday Bern and I rode on the Snake River guided ride. We crossed the river once, but the scenery was mostly high desert and open prairie.

On Saturday Bern, Curt and I rode on the Emmett Loop guided ride. This was a nice ride through some horse, cattle and farmland followed by a canyon and a stop at the dam. We started with chilly temperatures, got 15 minutes of rain around La Grande and then it warmed up on the way to our lunch stop in Pendleton. Bern, Mike & Melissa and I stayed in Yakima while Curt and Andy stayed in Selah. Curt and Andy needed to get to the motorcycle shipping port and then on to Sea-Tac for their flight home on Monday



On Monday, Mike and Melissa, Bern and I rode back on WA-97 to Highway 2. We stopped on the west side of Stevens Pass for a comfort stop at Deception Falls. If you have never stopped there, you should consider it.

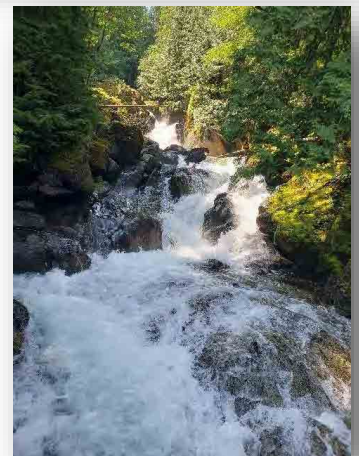

SAFETY WITHOUT



SOUND TIPS FROM SAFETY OFFICER, BP SCOTT

***On the highway, motorcycles are “small fry”.
They’re easy for autos and trucks to miss or disregard!***

Make it easy for automobile and truck drivers to see you.

Wear bright colored clothing. Fluorescent, orange and/or yellow shirts, vests, jackets, and helmets enhance visibility during the day. At night, wear reflective material on helmets, vests/ jackets, and even shoes.

Make it a habit to always use your turn signal.

Turn signals tell other drivers what you plan to do. They make your bike easier to see on the road. Nearby motor vehicle operators are more likely to notice your bike’s flashing turn signal than its activated taillight. Enhance your visibility by tapping your foot brake lightly before you slow down. Use hand signals as well.

Stay out of blind spots. – Motorcyclists are more at risk in a blind spot or no-zone than other motorists because their cycles are relatively small compared to trucks and automobiles

Keep your headlights on night and day. – Sound strange? Yes, but studies show that keeping your headlights on high beam during daylight hours increases your visibility to oncoming traffic and prevents accidents.

Wear a Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 218- compliant helmet every time you ride. It’s the law in many states so you may have no choice in the matter. Eye protection or goggles may be required in certain jurisdictions.

Accidents happen close to home, not just far away. Never say to yourself, “Well, I’m just going a mile or two to the store or to a friend’s house, why should I bother with a helmet?” Helmets save lives.

Follow state and local traffic laws.

Motorcyclists must follow the same “rules of the road” and traffic regulations as automobiles and trucks. These laws may be even more important to the safety of the motorcycle operator than to drivers of other motor vehicles. They were enacted to help ensure your safety.

Take a motorcycle rider skills training course. –

You can pay with your life if you don't learn the essential skills necessary to operate a motorcycle properly and safely. There are skills training courses not just for the novice but for the more experienced rider as well. Take the time to refresh and refine your rider techniques by taking an advanced skills course every few years.

Obtain the driver's license endorsement you need to legally operate a motorcycle in your state. – Statistics kept by The NHTSA tell us that 25% of the motorcyclists who died as a result of traffic accidents in 2004 were either not licensed at all or were not properly licensed to operate a motorcycle.

Don't speed. – In 2017, 36% of all motorcyclists involved in fatal accidents were speeding at the time of the accident. It's simple. Speed kills.

Following the suggestions outlined above will make for safer motorcycle operation. The stakes are high. And who has a greater interest in motorcycle safety than you or me? The biker who takes responsibility for ensuring he has taken every precaution to make his ride a safe one is less likely to find himself injured in a serious accident. Ride Safe and Enjoy!!

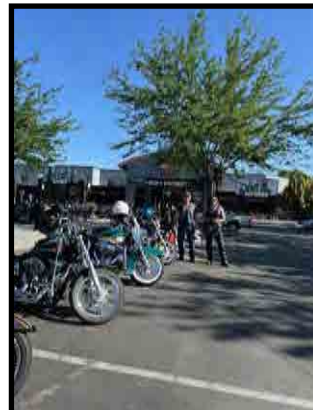
