Mount Vernon City Council 2022 Legislative Agenda: Year End Review

Concluding Remarks: A year ago, on January 19, 2022, I sent an e-mail (with a pdf of this legislative agenda "task analysis") to then City Council legislative assistant Elias Gootzeit, cc'ing each member of the city council and the heads of several of the city's neighborhood associations. The e-mail started like this: "I'm a city resident. I reviewed the CCs 2022 legislative agenda. It's really good. In an effort to help, I task analyzed each of the 7 items on the agenda. This will allow me, other residents, and the CC members too (if they are so inclined), to track CC progress toward meeting their stated objectives. Essentially, this is tool I (and others) can use to hold the cc accountable for their stated agenda, which I think is helpful for everyone."

Mr. Gootzeit seemed to appreciate the effort. He replied, "Dear Mr. McDonough, By this email, I am copying your email to each of the members of the Mount Vernon City Council, and the City Clerk. I am also requesting that it be added to the "referrals" list for the Working Session where it can be assigned to the appropriate Council Committee as correspondence. Please be assured that your attention to detail is the very effort that our City Council expected when it distributed its agenda. Your concern and inspired effort is very encouraging." City Council member, Ed Poteat, sent a follow up e-mail asking me to share the excel spreadsheet, which I did. No other City Council member responded.

By my account, the City Council never reported to the public about progress toward meeting their stated 2022 legislative agenda. This is unfortunate; it would have been helpful for them to give residents regular progress updates about a legislative agenda that they themselves established.

Here is my final report regarding progress the City Council made toward meeting their 2022 legislative agenda.

Methods: 2 city residents independently watched city council meetings, read meeting agendas (including legislation), and read available information on the city website and Facebook page. Then, each resident completed this review independently. If either or both residents thought there is public evidence that an agenda item is being addressed by the city council, a score of 1 was given. If both residents agreed that there is no public evidence that an agenda item is being addressed by the city council, a score of 0 was given. Scores of "1" are carried forward, so if evidence was presented to the public in Q1 that "City Council Processes & Protocols are being evaluated, updated, and codified", that score of "1" was carried forward to all future quarters. In this way, we attempted to give the City Council as much credit as possible for addressing their stated goals.

Calculating "percentage of agenda item addressed": To determine the "percentage of goal addressed" for each of the 7 agenda items established by the City Council, we totaled the "1" scores for all subobjectives of each agenda item across all 4 quarters of the year, and divided that number by the total number of scoring opportunities for the year. For example, for "Transparency, Efficiency & Accountability" there were a total of 5 subobjectives, so the total number of scoring opportunities was 5 subobjectives x 4 quarters or 20. The number of 1's scored was also 20, so 20/20 = 100%. So for that agenda item, the "percentage of agenda item addressed" is 100%.
