

DAY 1 | LIMA – CUSCO - URUBAMBA

09:16 AM Half day to Pisac market and archaeological site

In the morning, you are picked up from Cusco airport to cross mountains and valleys, where Andean landscapes, local culture, and traditional villages are combined. Your tour begins in Pisac with a visit to the archaeological site of Pisac, renowned for its extensive Inca terracing (andenes) and impressive Inca architectural remains, the largest in the Sacred Valley. It continues in the Pisac market, where local artisans display hundreds of products on their stalls, from textiles to replica Inca ceramics. After touring the market, a vehicle takes you to the hotel in the Sacred Valley.

DAY 2 | URUBAMBA

09:00 AM Private full-day tour to Chinchero, Living Museum of Yucay, and Ollantaytambo from Urubamba (Sacred Valley)

Start your tour today by heading to the picturesque village of Chinchero. You will begin by exploring the impressive agricultural terraces and the 17th-century church, built upon an ancient Inca palace and recognized as one of Peru's earliest Catholic structures. Along the route, there will be a stop at a lookout point to enjoy the spectacular landscapes of the Sacred Valley. Next, you will visit the Living Museum of Yucay, where you can witness the creation of textiles, adobe crafts, ceramics, and silverware using ancient Inca techniques. You will savor a delightful typical lunch in the Sacred Valley. After lunch, head to the impressive Ollantaytambo Fortress, an important ceremonial center renowned for its stunning agricultural terraces cascading down the surrounding mountainsides. Upon concluding this full-day tour, you will return to the hotel to rest and soak in the renewed Incan spirit. The Chinchero market is included in tourist visits scheduled for Sundays. 13:30 PM Enjoy a buffet lunch at La Hanka restaurant.

DAY 3 | URUBAMBA

08:30 AM Half day tour to Maras and Moray


Your day will begin with a tour of approximately an hour and a half to the archaeological sites of Moray and Maras. The archaeological remains of Moray consist of mysterious concentric circular terraces that, for some scholars, would be an agricultural research center. External platforms, more elevated, would be at higher temperatures than the inmates and could simulate the conditions of the different ecological floors of the empire. On the other hand, Maras is a surreal sight. It is an impressive complex of salt mining. These are large deposits of salt that were used to trade for other products with other regions of the empire. After the tour, return to your hotel.

12:00 PM Enjoy a delicious lunch at the UNU Tiobamba restaurant. It's an excellent place to experience the rich gastronomy and culture of Chinchero in an environment that combines comfort, authenticity, and natural beauty with the stunning landscapes around it.

14:30 PM Half-day four-wheelers tour in Huaypo lagoon

Visit a couple of the more unique and interesting sites in the Sacred Valley as Huaypo Lagoon. At the end of the tour, you will be transferred to your hotel in Valle.







DAY 4 | URUBAMBA - MACHU PICCHU

07:38 AM Our transportation and a representative will pick you up from the selected hotel in Urubamba (Sacred Valley) and transfer you to Ollantaytambo station, receive assistance upon your arrival.

08:53 AM Embark on PeruRail's Vistadome train from Ollantaytambo station to Aguas Calientes station (Machu Picchu Town) on a hour-and-a-half journey and receive assistance upon your arrival.

11:00 AM To explore the citadel today, you have the entrance to Circuit 2 Route A, which consists of the Classic Circuit of Machu Picchu. Circuit 2 represents the classic and most complete option for the visit to Machu Picchu. It blends the urban and agricultural zones, allowing you to explore both the upper and lower terraces and providing access to a wide variety of areas within the archaeological center. The tour begins on the lower platform, passing by the House of the Guardian, followed by a visit to the Temple of the Sun. It then continues through the House of the Inca, the Plaza of the Temples, the area of the Three Gates, the Hall of Mirrors, and, finally, the Temple of the Condor.

DAY 5 | MACHU PICCHU - CUSCO

14:55 PM Embark on PeruRail's Vistadome train from Aguas Calientes station (Machu Picchu Town) to Ollantaytambo station on an hour-and-a-half journey and receive assistance upon your arrival.

16:32 PM Our transportation service and a representative will pick you up at Ollantaytambo station and take you to your hotel in Cusco.

DAY 6 | CUSCO


09:00 AM Private half-day tour in Cusco to Coricancha, Cathedral, Sacsayhuaman, Qenqo, Puca Pucara, and Tambomachay

Explore the enchanting and historic city of Cusco, once the capital of the Inca empire. Begin with a visit to the Santo Domingo Convent, built on the foundations of the Coricancha temple. Next, discover the impressive Cathedral Basilica of the Virgin of the Assumption, the main church in town that houses a rich collection of colonial artworks, featuring impressive golden altarpieces, paintings from the renowned Cusco School, and religious sculptures. Explore the ancient hills of Cusco, including the Sacsayhuaman Fortress, the Qenqo archaeological complex, and the Puca Pucara military complex. Conclude with a visit to Tambomachay, known as the Inca spa, and, finally, return to your hotel.

DAY 7 | CUSCO

05:00 AM Vinicunca, also known as Rainbow Mountain, is a natural wonder located 5,200 meters above sea level. The tour departs early in the morning from Cusco and goes towards Cusipata, where breakfast will be served. Continue the journey to the starting point of the excursion to Rainbow Mountain, enjoying beautiful landscapes such as the Ausangate Mountain, one of the most prominent in Cusco. Later, there will be a stop at the mountain viewpoint to take photos and rest. The return trek heads towards Phullawasipata before taking the bus back to Cusipata for lunch. Finally, return to your selected hotel in Cusco.

Stop at the Park of Barranco and have a taste also of the typical picarones, a fabulous dessert of sweet flavor, crispy and warm, dripping with syrup.

19:00 PM Learn to prepare some of the most representative cocktails of Peru in a participatory class at the elegant Hotel B. The class is carried out by an experienced bartender who explains the history of the drinks and the elements used for each one. Each cocktail will be paired with a delicious accompaniment. Take advantage of this experience to learn about local cocktails in this luxurious hotel, located in a mansion of the early twentieth century.

DAY 10 | LIMA

Breakfast. Free time. Transfer to the airport.

ENTRANCE & GUIDE:

- The first entrance to the citadel requires the mandatory accompaniment of a guide. Please note that the guided tour lasts approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes.
- Guided groups have a maximum of 16 passengers per guide.
- The selection of the Machu Picchu circuit will be made based on availability at the time of booking confirmation.
- You must bring the same ID document you presented to the agency, as the train tickets and Machu Picchu entry tickets will be issued with the same information. It is important to take into account that the entrance tickets to the citadel are non-refundable from the time of purchase.

LUGGAGES:

- If passengers spend the night in the Sacred Valley, we will take care of transferring the luggage to the hotel in Cusco. On the other hand, if they stay in Cusco, the luggage will remain in the hotel storage.
- Carry the same document that you presented to the agency, given that train tickets and entrance to Machu Picchu will be issued with this information.
- In all train services to Machu Picchu, the passenger may carry only hand luggage (backpack, bag, or briefcase) of no more than 5 kg/11 lb. on the train to/from Machu Picchu. You will find your luggage at the chosen hotel.
