
We had a total of 18 scholarship applications submitted from all areas of Oklahoma. The following students have each won a \$500 scholarship from the OK JCI Senate and have been submitted to the US JCI Senate for judging. If chosen these 2 outstanding students could earn an additional \$1500 scholarship.

Brooke Clark attends Mountain View-Gotebo High School. Her student activities in sports include Softball, Basketball and Cross County. Her numerous awards include 4H Junior Citizen /award, Masonic Student of Today, Oklahoma High School Honor Society, Academic Excellence Award from her High School and Honor Roll at Tulsa Community College. Her community service include Chairing a fundraiser for her FFA Chapter, Mountain View-Gotebo Free Fair, School Concession Stand, Carnegie Food Pantry and volunteer in an elementary classroom with special need students. She has been accepted to OSU. She has already completed 18 college credits from TCC. Her plan is to major in nursing. Her goal is to pursue a BSN degree, with a focus on pediatrics and eventually become a pediatric nurse practitioner. She also plans to continue her community service by volunteering at local food pantries and hospitals.

Kendal Brunk attends Southwest Covenant High School in Yukon. She is active in 4-H and achieved both junior and senior 4-H Hall of Fame for Canadian Couty. She also received the State Award in the Dog Project area, certifying her own therapy dog. Her student sports activity was Basketball. She served as a water girl for the varsity football team and is currently serving as a manager for the track team. She plays flute in the concert band and works as a Summer Camp Counselor. She has volunteered with a local Equine Therapy program and shadowed Occupational Therapists in both a clinical setting and hospital setting. She has also been accepted to OSU and plans to earn her bachelor's degree in Applied Exercise Science-Pre-Professional. She has already completed 27 college credits, earned 33 on her ACT and has a 4.0 GPA. Her goal is to become a Doctor of Occupational Therapy. Her greatest passion is helping and serving young people and helping them embrace and overcome obstacles they face.

In addition to the above winners, a \$500 scholarship was awarded to a young man that our judges deemed hard working, deserving and in need of help. Joshua Merkle is homeschooled and lives in Claremore. He volunteers at two different nursing homes. He feels that singing to them brings a little hope and joy to these residents. He has 12 siblings and was always encouraged to think about what they wanted to be. This led him to believe he could become a nurse, work his way through college, then apply to medical school to become a doctor. He became a Certified Nursing Assistant and graduated top of his class. He is also a Home Health Certified Assistant and is currently taking an EMT-B class at Northeast Technology Center. He is hoping to eventually get a college scholarship and pursue his dream of becoming a doctor but has decided for now to major in Gunsmithing at Murray State College.

Region VIII NVP – Leesa Peebles – "Til have what she's having!" – Harry Met Sally movie.







