WREATH LAYING: If you and fellow Senators in your area want to help lay the wreaths on the day of the event, please go to this website to find locations near you:

You will see a map of the US. Click on Oklahoma and continue clicking till you see icon near your area. Click on the icon to get a list of participating cemeteries. You can then click on a particular cemetery and VIEW details for time of event. You can click on SPONSOR if you want to purchase a wreath for that specific cemetery.

<u>SPONSOR A WREATH</u>: The US JCI Senate is participating in the \$5 Pay It Forward Program. By sponsoring a wreath for \$17, the organization receives \$5 credit toward additional wreaths. Becky Edwards #62937 Scholarship Chair

The United States JCI Senate Foundation was created in 1987 to provide scholastic funding to all eligible high school seniors who are going to continue their education at any accredited college or vocational school in the United States. High seniors who are U.S. citizens must apply to the JCI Senate state organization in which they reside. The state organization will distribute the applications, judge those returned, then forward the

top two academic applications to the national competition coordinated by the Foundation Trustees. The state organization can now also submit the top vocational

application for a total of three applications. National winners are chosen by a panel of university level judges selected by the Foundation. Applicants need not be children or relatives of anyone affiliated with the JCI Senate organization.

Oklahoma's scholarship awards are currently \$1,000 each for its top two academic applications and \$500 for the top vocational application. Applications will be available for the 2025-2026 school year by August 1st. The applications will be available at that time on our website, https://oklahomajcisenate.org/. The scholarship committee will judge all applications received by the deadline of January 17, 2026.

Judging will be held on Saturday, February 7th in the Tulsa area. Specific place will be determined by the number of applications received.

MADAM MAYOR

Teresa Mullican made Elk City history several ways.

She was the first woman to serve as Elk City Mayor.

She served in that role longer than anyone.

She was also the first woman to serve as a local civic organization's president.

Mullican, Elk City's 29th mayor, held that office for eight terms, from 1997 to 2013.

Those 16 years are the record for the longest tenure in that office.

And of the more than 30 individuals who've been mayor since 1907, Mullican is the only woman.

"Serving as mayor of Elk City for 16 years has been one of the greatest honors of my life," Mullican said. "I am humbled to have been the first woman to hold this position and grateful for the trust and support of our community."

She was no stranger to elective office. When she was first elected mayor in 1997, she'd been serving on the City Commission since 1991.

Mullican was also elected Oklahoma Jaycees President in 1995.

Then, in 2000, she became the first woman elected President of Elk City's Rotary Club.

"Elk City will always hold a special place in my heart," Mullican said.

And she will always hold a special place in Elk City's heart.

One big reason for this is that Mayor Mullican started the annual Mayor's Toy Drive in 2004 to help make Christmas special for less advantaged local kids. It's continued every year since, and this year's toy drive begins this month.

Mullican relocated to Alaska where she owns a stained-glass business, works in human resources, and takes photographs professionally.

For 16 years, though, she was The Honorable Teresa Mullican, history-making Elk City political and civic leader.
