

BEING AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING THE LICENSING OF DOGS, THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY, FIXING THE SPEED LIMIT FOR VEHICLES, DISCHARGING FIRE ARMS AND GOVERNING THE CONTROL OF TREES IN THE STREETS, WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF DIETRICH, STATE OF IDAHO:

Be it ordained by the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Dietrich, Lincoln County, Idaho.

## CHAPTER I

Section 1.

The owner, harborer or keeper of any dog within the village limits shall on or before the first day of April, of each year hereafter, procure an annual license for it and shall pay the sum of \$3.00 for each and every female dog, and the sum of \$1.00 for each and every male dog, which shall entitle him to a receipt designating the owner's name and the number on the license, which number will correspond with that worn by the dog.

Section 2.

No person or persons shall permit or suffer any livestock, chickens, ducks, turkeys or geese or other poultry owned by them to run at large within the Village limits.

Section 3.

No vehicle shall be driven within the Village limits at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour.

Section 4.

No person, not an officer of the law, shall discharge any fire arms within the limits of the Village of Dietrich.

Section 5.

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Dietrich are hereby given full and complete control over all trees growing within the confines of the Village limits, outside of the property lines of the respective lots and acreage, and the board shall also have the power to require the owner of the lots adjoining such trees to remove at such owner's expense any such trees which in the opinion of the Village board are a menace to life or property. Except as above provided, it shall be unlawful for the owner of such trees or anyone else to remove, cut or otherwise mutilate such trees without the consent of the Village board.

Section 6.

Any person, firm, or corporation, who shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter I, shall be fined not less than \$1.00 or more than \$100.00.
