"Whoa there Ed! What are you doing in such a hurry?" Bartley calmed down, trying not to spray his spikey needles.

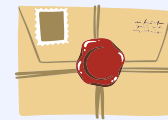
"No time to talk such conversation!" Eddie yelled.

TROPICAL CYCLONES

Tropical cyclones are large, rotating masses of warm air and thunderstorm clouds. They have a low pressure in their center and can bring heavy rain and wind to areas inside of the system. They strengthen over warm waters and weaken over colder waters, wind shear(a change in wind speed in a small area at high altitudes), and land. They can occur in many places on the Earth, in the Pacific, Atlantic, and the Indian Oceans. These storms may be destructive, but there are many official agencies responsible for forecasting them and making preparations. Also, they may sometimes be beneficial to areas that need it.

Tropical cyclones have different names in different places. A storm of over 75 miles per hour in the North and South Atlantic Ocean and the Eastern and Central Pacific Ocean is called a hurricane, in the Western Pacific Ocean it is called a typhoon, and everywhere else a cyclone. Tropical cyclones also move differently in different places. In the Northern Hemisphere, they usually move west, then north, and finally east in a large "C" shape. In the Southern Hemisphere, they move west, south, and then east, also in a "C" shape.

As their name suggests, tropical cyclones usually form and intensify in the tropics. This is because the waters there are warm and can allow storms to absorb the water vapor the ocean generates and strengthen. They almost always come from a persistent area of clouds and thunderstorms called the Intertropical Convergence Zone(ITCZ). When a sufficiently large clump of thunderstorms comes together, it pulls warm, moist air from the ocean and creates a low pressure area, and begins spinning due to the Earth's spin. In the Northern Hemisphere, they spin counterclockwise and clockwise in the Southern Hemisphere. In addition, a tropical cyclone needs to have a warm core to be officially recognized as a tropical system.

Storms strengthen when the ocean is deep and warm, the air is moist, and wind shear is low. The water evaporates, and warm air rises to make the pressure lower. This allows for outside air to be pulled in faster, making the storm stronger. When a storm is sufficiently strong, an eye may form in the center of the system. Eyes of tropical cyclones are occasionally replaced, weakening the storm briefly and creating a new eye. Sometimes, when all of these conditions are favorable enough, a storm can explosively intensify and strengthen very fast. They weaken when they move over cold waters and land because they lose convection(flow of warm air and water vapors inside the storm), and they weaken over wind shear because it pushes the convection away.

El Niño and La Niña are two worldwide climate events that control which part of the world gets more tropical cyclones, usually La Niña brings more damage and El Niño brings more storms. La Niña makes the Atlantic have more storms and El Niño makes the Pacific have more storms. We are currently in a weak La Niña that is forecast to dissipate soon. In addition, La Niña usually happens when the global temperature drops, and El Niño usually happens when the global temperature rises. Both of these events usually last for a few years, then they switch.

When they approach land, tropical cyclones may cause damage to the area. Possible hazards include high winds, flooding, and large waves known as storm surges. They have been destructive before, like Katrina in 2005 or Harvey in 2017. Climate change may affect the future of tropical cyclones because it makes the oceans warmer, leading to stronger storms. In addition, strong storms may sometimes form tornadoes when on land. However, many people are working to solve the issue of climate change, making the ocean colder and storms weaker. In addition, many official agencies like the Joint Typhoon Warning Center(JTWC), the National Hurricane Center(NHC), and many more in other regions help make predictions about the intensity and track of storms to protect people who may be impacted by these storms.

Tropical cyclones may not always be a natural disaster. In some places around the world, there are dry deserts that need rain from an occasional remnant low, tropical depression, or the edge of a stronger system. For example, the people in Somalia got much-needed rain when Tropical Storm 02A in 2008 brought moderate rain to Somalia when many people were left without water in the Somalia War between 2006 and 2009. In addition, if tropical cyclones did not exist, the subtropics would be much colder than what it currently is, causing a large temperature imbalance between areas.

Tropical cyclones are interesting and sometimes devastating phenomena that are unique in many ways. They are large, rotating storms fueled by warm water, moist air, low wind shear, and strong enough Coriolis effect to get it to spin. It may occasionally bring damage to coastal areas, but there are numerous government agencies, large corporations, and influential people that try to prevent damage caused by these storms. They may also bring some benefits, like balancing the global temperature and giving rain to areas needing water. Tropical systems are natural wonders that come and go, but will stay in our minds for years to come.
