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Changes to come

Our amazing support workers have been very patient and accommodating on the issue of charging mileage. Basically they haven't been and they generously carry the never ending escalating cost of running their vehicle themselves.

That will change in 2023 and now that Mable gives them the capacity to add mileage to their invoices, we are asking that they do so. It will make no difference to the way your services are provided, but it will add a fair travel charge. It won't make a difference to those of you who receive services in Bell by Bell locals, but it will change for non locals and for longer trips for various appointments and shopping.

It is an ongoing conversation we have with the good folk who provide your services and now, two years into the project, we consider it is only fair that the cost of running a vehicle is included in the cost of providing services.

How we're tracking

- We currently have 85 people in our Care Project.
- 52 are using their Home Care Packages and receiving services in their home.
- 33 people are awaiting their Home Care Package.
- 18 local people are now being employed through the project.
- We are now assisting clients in Dalby, Jandowae and Kaimkillenbun.



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Aged Care Quality Standards

There are many changes coming, or already here, regarding provision of services to our elderly. Basically, a lot of the rules which have applied in the past to residential care are now being extended to care at home. Two of the most important are:

SIRS (Serious Incident Reporting Scheme)

and

Aged Care Code of Conduct Acknowledgement

We will be requiring all our workers to sign the Code of Conduct in the very near future.

We will also be very proactive about having to report serious incidents falls, abuse, psychological or physical trauma, hospital admissions (and discharges), unexplained absences. We know that falls and illnesses happen, without us knowing - sometimes we hear via the grapevine days or weeks later, sometimes we are the first phone call. There is significant liability on us to look after you - and significant responsibility on you to keep us informed. We don't want to know every move you make, but we most definitely need to know if you have a fall/accident or are unwell.

Self management in our arena is about keeping our elderly ageing well and safely at home. We can only do that if we work as a team. We have a wonderful team of support workers, who are also very proactive in letting us know if they are concerned about you and we are grateful for their care.

Otherwise, we think that we have a pretty good track record for compliance with the Code of Conduct - we are always open to feedback if you feel we are lacking in any way or we could do things better.

A fund raiser.
