#### Update & News from our Founder & President, Lesley Bryce:

After the crazy first half of this year, it's been nice to be back in my community. As numbers grow, we are often looking for a short-notice social support worker, so I am usually it. I'm enjoying getting back to knowing all of you again.

We have had a lot of losses over this last year – friends passing away, or going into care, or moving to live with children. In our industry, they say that we should allow a 10% attrition rate – which we are well and truly above this year. This, of course, is reflected in our numbers but it is also reflected in our Partnership contributions from Trilogy Care as HCPs are cancelled or withdrawn. We do run a very tight ship but when the bottom line is continually eroding then we just have to be more creative. Of course, we do continue to provide the same high level of service as always – numbers will always come back – but some things just have to take second place.

You will know that, after a trial period, we opted not to run an office in Dalby. New clients are happy to be seen at home and Bettina goes into town one day a week, with a list of appointments and visits our Dalby clients. This is working out much better all round and saving us the rent on an office.

We are looking at making changes to our social events in the New Year and we would love to hear your feedback. Unfortunately, the attendance numbers at our regular morning teas are becoming smaller. What do you think? Maybe just once a month morning tea? Do you have any ideas of how we could do it differently? I'm always open to suggestions. I firmly believe the social gatherings are vital to the social cohesion of our community model, we can stay in touch with each other, it gives you an opportunity to ask questions etc.

On a final note, our Burgers and Brews night of the 24th August was a great night for all who came along. Disappointingly, our attendance numbers were smaller than we had hoped, but we did raise some funds. We had some great helpers and a few nice donations and are grateful for the support of our community and those that could attend. As you may know, fundraising events for community groups can be very hard with limited resources and support, so we love to hear of any ideas for future fundraising events.

Other than that, we continue to advocate for our elders, providing a level of excellence of service to continue making the option of ageing at home safe and comfortable for all our clients.

#### TRILOGY CARE UPDATE

We would like to inform you that as of the 28th October 2024, major telecommunication providers will be switching off their 3G networks. This change will affect all devices that rely on the 3G network, not just mobile phones.

Please be aware that some Home Care Package (HCP) and Commonwealth Homes Support Programme (CHSP) recipients may still be using 3G-enabled Goods, Equipment, and Assistive Technology (GEAT) devices. This could include personal medical or alert alarms, which are critical for safety and wellbeing.

To ensure your devices remain operational and unaffected by this change, we strongly recommend that you check if your devices are impacted by visiting the link below:

If you find that your device is reliant on the 3G network, please take the necessary steps to update or replace it before the network shutdown.



In his own words, Laurie highlights his most recent experience where his Home Care Package was able to support him to live at home independently.

I have my independence back, as a diabetic and one who suffers from neuropathy badly, I found it harder and harder to distinguish when driving the accelerator and the brake. I would not be able to live with myself if I maimed a child or adult or worse killed someone, I decided that driving was not for me and sold my car.

Bell Cares organised an assessment by an Occupational Therapist who recommended me getting a mobility scooter. Once approved by Trilogy Care, Bell Cares liaised with Brian Cooper from Burnett Scooters to be the supplier of the scooter and accessories. On a personal basis I would recommend Brian for his professional attitude and eye towards detail.

So, if you see an old fellow on a red scooter coming towards you head for the hills!

#### Quick & Easy Recipes



#### MOIST ORANGE CAKE

Pre Time: 15 mins Cook time: 40 mins

Services: 8

#### Ingredients:

- 150 grams Butter (softened)
- 1 tablespoon Orange Rind (finely grated)
- <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup Caster Sugar
- 3 Eggs
- 1½ cups Self-Raising Flour
- ¼ cup Milk
- ¾ cup Icing Sugar
- 1½ tablespoons Orange Juice
- 1 tablespoon Desiccated Coconut (Optional)

#### **Method:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan-forced). and grease a 20cm-round deep cake pan.
- 2. In a medium bowl beat butter, rind, caster sugar, eggs, flour and milk with an electric mixer at low speed until just combined. Increase speed to medium, beat about 3 minutes or until mixture is smooth. (Alternatively mix by hand until smooth).
- 3. Spread mixture into pan. Bake for 40 minutes. Stand cake 5 minutes in the tin, then turn, top-side up onto wire rack to cool.
- **4.** Combine sifted icing sugar and juice in small bowl; spread over cake, sprinkle with optional coconut if desired.
