

"Yesterday is history, tomorrow is a mystery, today is a gift..."

The ADT January Social found us on a day of history and mystery. We started our day with a bit of unusual Houston history. We started our day at the Buffalo Bayou Park Cistern, located on Sabine Street, near downtown. The Cistern was one of the City of Houston's first underground drinking-water reservoirs. Built in 1926, it provided decades of service until it was decommissioned in 2007 due to an irreparable leak. The 87,500-square-foot expanse includes 25-foot tall concrete columns set row upon row, hovering over two inches of water on the reservoir's floor.







Dark and creepy, sounds seem to echo forever. We tested that theory and it was almost deafening. Recognizing the significance of the highly unusual space and with generous support from The Brown Foundation, Buffalo Bayou Partnership repurposed the Cistern into a magnificent public space. In addition to tours highlighting the history and architecture of this unique industrial site, the Cistern houses periodic art installations.







Our next stop was lunch at Stanton's City Bites, started as a family run grocery store in 1961 that evolved into a restaurant that serves unique, made to order burgers. As you can see, we had built up quite an appetite and were ready to dig in.

Next we moved into the mystery part of day which found us at "Escape the Room Houston" near midtown, a reality entertainment gaming experience in which you solve puzzles to earn your freedom to escape the room. Our assignment was to escape "the Apartment" within 60 minutes. We had to solve a series of puzzles and riddles that led us from one key or lock to another and on to the next clue. There were locks on the refrigerator, the microwave, cupboards, game boards, and so many other places.













It was truly a team effort, with everyone contributing to the success of our efforts. We made it out in plenty of time and only needed a couple of clues to do so. Everyone one agreed it was a fun day, especially for a rainy, gloomy Sunday. Definitely something we all would do again!






