

BEGINNING DAY 2024




If the day already hadn't been special enough, the social committee then presented us with another gift and read the following:

Before we headed back across the "pond", we ended our day with what else, this cute pink pick-up with our friends "the bears" driving it.












First stamp in our passport, France!! So where will our adventure's take us next? Will it be by plane, train or automobile? Well, stay tuned to the next Bustle report to find out.
