The oldest living rose is 1000 years old and can be found in Germany. There are rose fossils that date back 35 million years. All varieties are edible and rose water is often to jellies, jams and sweets. Their berry shaped fruit is called a rose hip and are packed with vitamin C. Its essences is also used in perfums and fragrances.

Roses come in a variety of colors, each with its own meaning. Red-love, romance; White-innocence and spirituality; Yellow-friendship, cheer; Pink grace, elegance; Orange-enthusiasm and energy; Lavender-love at first sight, wonder, enchantment. The rose is the US national flower and the state flower of Georgia, Iowa, New York, N. Dakota, and Washington D.C. Fifty four percent of the land in Ecuador is covered in rosed and the most expensive rose sold for over \$15.8 million. Many roses have been named after famous people nad/oor celebrities like Elizabeth Taylor, Barbara Streisand, Julia Child, Laura Bush and Elvis Presley.






