They are a group of flowering plants which are important in culture and literature in much of the world. Most species are native to the Northern Hemisphere and can range 1-6 feet. They are active in spring in summer and dormant in winter and come in a variety of colors: white, red, yellow, orange, purple... They are used in Chinese and Japanese cuisines as well as the diets of N. American indigenous people. Medicinal uses include: skin care, reducing fever, reducing wrinkles, and in pain reduction. 
