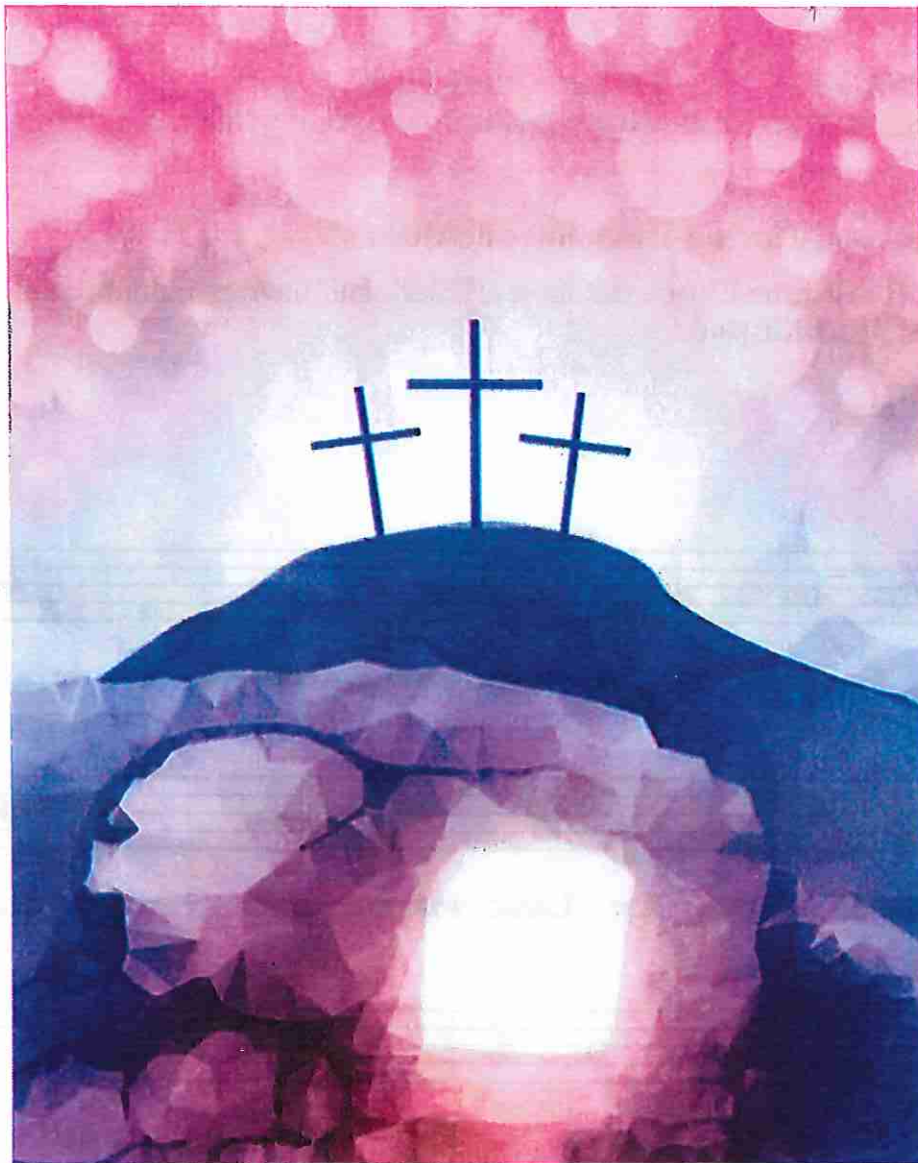

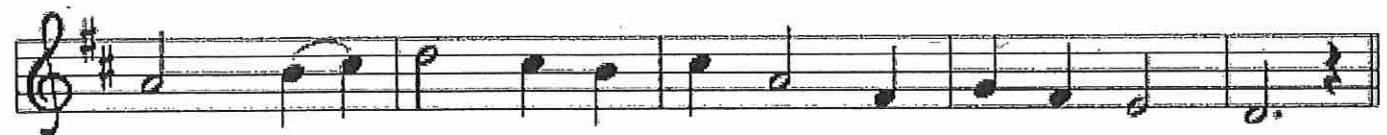

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

READING

1 Peter 1:3-9 (The Message)

This epistle was written to encourage Christians experiencing hardships and suffering because of their faith in Christ. The letter opens by blessing God for the living hope we have through Christ’s resurrection even amid difficult circumstances and surroundings.

A reading from First Peter.

³⁻⁵ What a God we have! And how fortunate we are to have this Father of our Master Jesus! Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we’ve been given a brand-new life and have everything to live for, including a future in heaven. The future starts now! God is keeping careful watch over us and the future. The Day is coming when you’ll have it all, life healed and whole.

⁶⁻⁷ I know how great this makes you feel, even though you have to put up with every kind of aggravation in the meantime. Pure gold put in the fire comes out of it *proved* pure; genuine faith put through this suffering comes out *proved* genuine. When Jesus wraps this all up, it’s your faith, not your gold, that God will have on display as evidence of his victory.

⁸⁻⁹ You never saw Jesus, yet you love him. You still don’t see Jesus, yet you trust him—with laughter and singing. Because you kept on believing, you’ll get what you’re looking forward to: total salvation.

Matthew 28:1-10 (The Message)

Sorrow gives way to "fear and great joy" when two women are sent by an angel to proclaim the good news: Jesus is risen!

The holy gospel according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

28¹⁻⁴ After the Sabbath, as the first light of the new week dawned, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to keep vigil at the tomb. Suddenly the earth reeled and rocked under their feet as God's angel came down from heaven, came right up to where they were standing. He rolled back the stone and then sat on it. Shafts of lightning blazed from him. His garments shimmered snow-white. The guards at the tomb were scared to death. They were so frightened, they couldn't move.

⁵⁻⁶ The angel spoke to the women: "There is nothing to fear here. I know you're looking for Jesus, the One they nailed to the cross. He is not here. He was raised, just as he said. Come and look at the place where he was placed.

⁷ "Now, get on your way quickly and tell his disciples, 'He is risen from the dead. He is going on ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there.' That's the message."

⁸⁻¹⁰ The women left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy and ran to tell his disciples. Then Jesus met them, stopping them in their tracks. "Good morning!" he said. They fell to their knees, embraced his feet, and worshiped him. Jesus said, "You're holding on to me for dear life! Don't be frightened like that. Go tell my brothers and sisters that they are to go to Galilee, and that I'll meet them there."





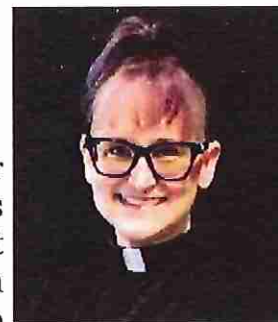

Help our seminary student, April Mulvey, with her Journey to Healing in Seattle, WA



“Most of you know my wife, April, whether from the rooms of recovery or the halls of the church. When I met my wife at Common Ground, she was active and vibrant, and her dedication to serving others and God is what made me fall in love with her. But as time went on, I watched her health steadily decline, beginning with stomach issues, to numerous visits to different doctors, multiple misdiagnoses, not being heard, and now having permanent damage as a result of this long journey. I have watched April suffer year after year, all the while, going through seminary. What a warrior she is!

After ten years of watching my wife suffer without any results, I decided enough was enough, and made a call to the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center in Seattle, WA, to see if they would accept her as a patient. Having dealt with FHCC in the past with previous family members, I know they ‘provide the latest cancer treatment options’ and are ‘known for breakthroughs impacting both cancer and infectious diseases worldwide’ (www.fredhutch.org). There, April will receive a whole team of multi-disciplinary doctors who will communicate with each other and develop a specialized treatment just for her. Our first appointment is June 11, and we are leaving on June 7 to drive out there. Our plan is to stay in Seattle for at least one month while April goes for initial consultations with her team of doctors, have her testing done, and any imaging, and come up with a treatment plan that gets down to the causes and conditions of her illness.”
