We hoard resources while our neighbors are hungry and cold.


We speak in ways that silence others. We are silent when we should speak up.

33-34 "This is the brand-new covenant that I will make with Israel when the time comes. I will put my law within them—write it on their hearts!—and be their God. And they will be my people. They will no longer go around setting up schools to teach each other about God. They'll know me firsthand, the dull and the bright, the smart and the slow. I'll wipe the slate clean for each of them. I'll forget they ever sinned!"

²⁴⁻²⁵ "Listen carefully: Unless a grain of wheat is buried in the ground, dead to the world, it is never any more than a grain of wheat. But if it is buried, it sprouts and reproduces itself many times over. In the same way, anyone who holds on to life just as it is destroys that life. But if you let it go, reckless in your love, you'll have it forever, real and eternal.

²⁶ "If any of you wants to serve me, then follow me. Then you'll be where I am, ready to serve at a moment's notice. The Father will honor and reward anyone who serves me.

²⁷⁻²⁸ "Right now I am shaken. And what am I going to say? 'Father, get me out of this'? No, this is why I came in the first place. I'll say, 'Father, put your glory on display.'"

A voice came out of the sky: "I have glorified it, and I'll glorify it again."

²⁹ The listening crowd said, "Thunder!"

Others said, "An angel spoke to him!"

³⁰⁻³³ Jesus said, "The voice didn't come for me but for you. At this moment the world is in crisis. Now Satan, the ruler of this world, will be thrown out. And I, as I am lifted up from the earth, will attract everyone to me and gather them around me." He put it this way to show how he was going to be put to death.

We remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but our central focus is his commandment to give and receive love in humble service to one another, embodied by Jesus as he washed the disciples' feet.

Good Friday ♦ March 29, 7:00 p.m.

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday, joining the disciples at the foot of the cross.

Easter Vigil & March 30, 7:30 p.m.

Together with Common Ground Recovery Community in Lundin Hall, we gather around fire, word, water, bread, and cup, proclaiming through story and song that ours is a God who continuously brings life out of death.

Easter Sunday & March 31, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m.

This is the day the Lord has made! Christ is risen, and through him all creation is made new! Festive worship at two services, both featuring Basic'ly Brass and a Festival Choir. Christ is risen indeed! Nursery available at both services.
