

These forty days called Lent are like no other. It is our opportune time to return to the God who rescues, to receive the gifts of God's grace, to believe with the heart and confess with the mouth the wonder of God's love in Jesus, and to resist temptation at every turn. This is no small pilgrimage on which we have just embarked. It is a struggle Jesus knew. It is a struggle Jesus shares. Though we sometimes doubt and often resist God's desire to protect and save us, our God persists. In holy baptism, God's people have been called and gathered into a Godinitiated relationship that will endure. Lent provides the church with a time and a tradition in which to seek God's face again. Lent provides another occasion to behold the God of our salvation in the face of the Blessed One who "comes in the name of the Lord."

Third Sunday in Lent ♦ March 23 ♦ 10:00 AM the Rev. Katie Lyon

The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us.

The psalm sets the tone this day: "Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sin is put away!" Happy is the father at the return of his prodigal son. Happy are we that our sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Rejoice!


Another way to observe Lent this year is to join us on Wednesday evenings for worship with our ministry partner

Perseverance in Prayer

The Atonement Prayer Team wishes to honor the memory of two of our founding members who passed away in 2024 and for whom we have made a donation to the Thanksgiving and Memorial Fund.

In the 30 years I have been at Atonement there has been a Weekly Prayers list in the bulletin and now online with a link https://atonementwyo.org/weekly-prayers on the church website under the Ministries menu, and in the weekly email about the Sunday service. All members and friends of Atonement are invited to pray for the people on this list.

In the 1990s Faith Ann Jones organized a Prayer Chain phone tree to supplement the bulletin list. When someone called the church or Faith Ann directly and asked for prayer, the phone tree jumped into action. Prayers started immediately and continued for 30 days. Sometimes we were praying for several people and sometimes there was no one that needed extra prayer. I joined the Prayer Chain in 1999 and only had to be habitual for 30 days at a time.

On September 28, 2006 Bob Sharetts started a monthly meeting with a mission "to pray with and for those who are hurting, and encourage others to follow Christ's teaching about God's promise for prayer by offering opportunities to study, share, and learn about prayer." The Prayer Chain phone tree prayer partners were incorporated into this group which Bob led until December 2012 and in which he participated until the month before his death at age 95. This team maintains a list to supplement the Weekly Prayers list, of people who need confidential prayer. There are about a hundred people and families on this list for whom we pray daily. Some team members through the years have not attended meetings but committed to pray daily at home.

With the help of Faith Ann and Bob, and all the other past and present members of the Atonement Prayer Team, I have learned to be more habitual in my prayer life. For me, prayer removes hopelessness. It reminds me that I am not the center of the universe; it gives me perspective. Prayer raises my awareness of God acting in the world. Knowing that God is only a prayer away is comforting, not warm fuzzy blanket comfortable, but deep inside comforting. I pray for that comfort for all of the people on the prayer lists at Atonement and for all of you reading this.
