Time After Pentecost ♦ September 3

The prophet Jeremiah speaks of the incurable wound of his suffering yet finds in God's words the delight of his heart. When Peter doesn't grasp Jesus' words about suffering, Jesus tells the disciples they will find their lives in losing them. Such sacrificial love is described by Paul when he urges us to associate with the lowly and not repay evil with evil. In worship we gather as a community that we might offer ourselves for the sake of our suffering world.

Rally Day, Blessing of the Quilt ♦ September 10

Conflict is a part of relationships and life in community. Jesus' words in today's gospel are often used in situations having to do with church discipline. The prophet Ezekiel tells of warning the wicked to turn from their ways, and Paul reminds us that love is the fulfilling of the law. We gather in the name of Christ, assured that he is present among us with gifts of peace and reconciliation.

Time After Pentecost ♦ September 17

Jesus' summary of the law in today's gospel reminds us that we are called not only to love God with heart, soul, and mind, but also to love our neighbor as ourselves. It is this deep care of neighbor that compels the faithful to live lives of generosity to others, ministering to those who are poor, hungry, naked, sick, or estranged.

Matthew narrates one of Jesus' controversial parables in which Jesus says that the reign of God is like that of a landowner who pays his workers the same wage no matter what time of day they began to work. When God changes God's mind about punishing Nineveh for their evil ways, Jonah is angry. Yet God is gracious and merciful, abounding in steadfast love. In baptism we receive the grace of God that is freely given to all. As Martin Luther wrote, in the presence of God's mercy we are all beggars.

Confirmation at Atonement

The confirmation ministry at Atonement is a two-year program that includes worship, learning, and serving, as well as forming a community built on respect, support, and love. Students in the program are normally 7th and 8th graders or older, with 9th graders (or older) affirming their baptism (we often say “getting confirmed”!) on Reformation Sunday (this year it's October 29).

Can we talk about a dirty word? A dirty word in church? Do I have your attention?



It's not really a dirty word it's just sometimes viewed that way. Want to take a guess at what it is? I'll give you a hint. **It's Everything we do we after we say, We Believe!** It's God's people working together to protect and care for all that we have been given: the earth, family and friends, strangers, animals, our special skills and yes even our money. The word is ... Stewardship.

Want proof? Think about how the Apostles creed begins: **"I believe** in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. **I believe** in Jesus Christ, his only begotten son, our Lord." Our goal is to create and hold events that bind us together not only as a congregation but as a larger community of God's people.

We are planning activities that will give each of you an opportunity to use your gifts or your time to glorify God's name. Your participation can be as simple as bringing a bag of candy to support a Safe Trick or Treat event that Atonement's Preschool and Council are working on together. If you love watching children parade in their costumes and want to do more than that, then come help hand out the candy.

Additional activities that are in the works will be varied, including Rally Day pancake breakfast, a celebration of our wonderful grounds crew, Pastor Katie's installation celebration, Community Safe Trick or Treat, a holiday Kids' Night out, and the annual chili cookoff. We've even designed a new Atonement T-shirt that we hope you'll all love and wear when we march in the July 4th parade in 2024. Join us in any, or all of the fun.

And if you do, you'll meet new best friends and get to share your stories of faith. Stewardship is not just about the money. True, that's a part of it, but there's so much more. There are dozens of opportunities for you to serve God at Atonement and in our world. Please prayerfully considered what gifts you have to give and then as the Nike slogan says "Just Do it!"

I can tell you from personal experience that by putting yourself out there, the gifts you get back will be far greater than anything that you give.

Small Groups beginning in September

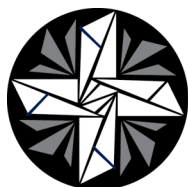
Common Ground will offer three small groups this fall. All groups are free, and anyone is welcome to join, but space is limited, so use the QR codes below to register today.

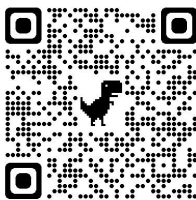

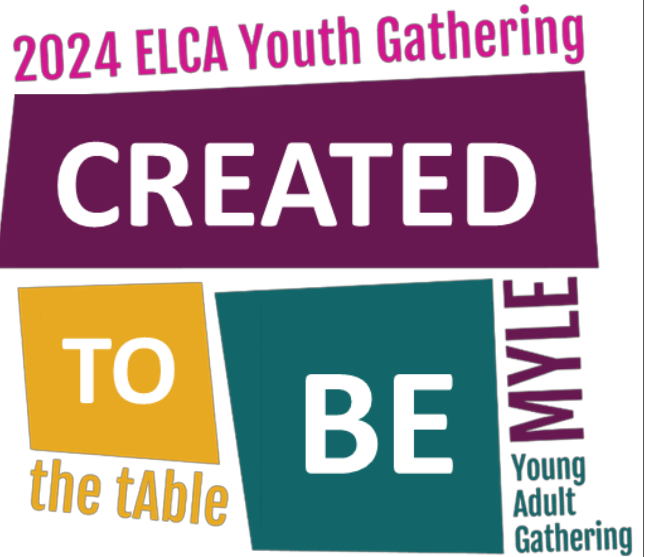
Calling All Golfers
