We gather in the name of Christ, assured that he is present among us with gifts of peace and reconciliation.

In today’s second reading Paul questions why we judge one another, since we all stand before the judgment of God. Yet we do sin against one another, and Jesus’ challenge that we forgive seventy-seven times reveals God’s boundless mercy. When we hear the words of forgiveness in worship and sign ourselves with the cross, we are renewed in baptism to be signs of reconciliation in the world.

Matthew narrates one of Jesus’ controversial parables in which Jesus says that the reign of God is like that of a landowner who pays his workers the same wage no matter what time of day they began to work. When God changes God’s mind about punishing Nineveh for their evil ways, Jonah is angry. Yet God is gracious and merciful, abounding in steadfast love. In baptism we receive the grace of God that is freely given to all. As Martin Luther wrote, in the presence of God’s mercy we are all beggars.

Jesus’ parable about two sons who don’t do what they say reveals surprises in the reign of God. In the reading from Ezekiel the people claim the ways of the Lord are unfair, while God offers repentance and new life. Paul urges us to look to Christ as a model of humility, putting the interests of others above our own. Nourished by the broken bread and shared cup, we offer our lives for the sake of our needy world.

Atonement Christian Preschool hosted on average 30 preschoolers each week of Summer Camp. In June, the campers learned all about different sports in Sports Camp; in July, they became cowboys and cowgirls in the Wild, Wild West and celebrated Holidays Around the World; in August, preschoolers went Down on the Farm as those going to kindergarten were gearing up in Kindergarten Kickstart. Thank you to the preschool families and staff for a fun four weeks of Summer Camp!



Over the summer, the preschool staff participated in a book study of Amanda Morgan’s book “Not Just Cute: How Powerful Play Drives Development in Early Childhood.” We read sections of the book and met three times to discuss what we had read. Overall, we believe in the importance of play and see that our preschool aligns with the author’s findings of its importance. The takeaway from the book study was how to share it with our preschool parents and the community. The staff are introducing the “Play of the Month” for the new school year. Each month a different teacher will video their students partaking in a specific type of play (ex: block play, playdough, dramatic play, etc.). Information on the type of play and how it helps in the development of young children, as well as simple ways to incorporate play at home, will be included in the video. We want to help build connections between home and school through play.

As of August 24, the preschool has 161 students registered with many students enrolled in multiple classes for a total of 214 filled spaces. **We have a few spots available in our Tues/Thurs Threes classes. Contact Jen Dauber for more information on how to register your 3-year-old!**

The preschool staff returned August 31 to prepare for the 2026-27 school year. I hosted Parent Nights on September 1 & 2 in the church for parents to complete the DHS required paperwork and review the Parent Handbook. We will hold Meet the Teacher sessions on September 8 & 9 for students and parents. Classes begin September 10 & 11. We will celebrate our 50th Anniversary on Sunday, September 13, and the new playground surface will be installed the week of September 14.

Helping Harvest

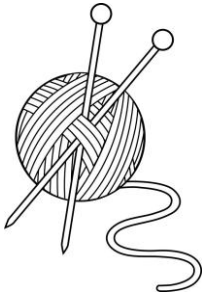

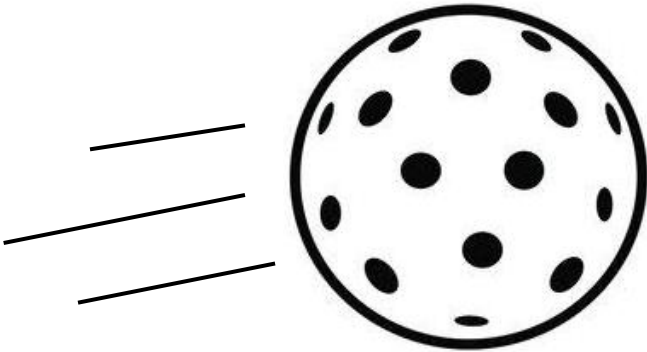
