2023 Tyler Rod and Gun Club 22LR Benchrest Competition Rules

- 1. Any rifle chambered for the 22LR round is eligible for use in our competitions.
- 2. There are three classes of competition:
 - a. Unlimited: custom built rifles; any rifle using a tuner, harmonic balancer, barrel weights, and or stock weights. All optics are acceptable. One- or two-piece rests are acceptable. Bipods are allowed.
 - b. Precision: Any mass-produced rifle with a bull, target, or heavy barrel that has a manufacturers suggested retail price of less than \$1250.00. All optics are acceptable.
 Only two-piece rests are allowed. Bipods are allowed. The front and rear rests cannot be connected to each other in any manner.
 - c. Sporter: Any mass-produced rifle that has a regular contour barrel that has a manufacturers suggested retail price of less than \$1250.00. The only optics that are allowed are fixed optic powers of 14X or less or variable power scopes of 14X and less. Furthermore, scopes that have MOA, Mil-Dot, BDC or any other type of ranging reticle are not allowed in the Sporter class. Only two-piece rests are allowed. Bipods are allowed. The front and rear rests cannot be connected to each other in any manner.
- 3. Entry fee for each class is \$15.00
- 4. Competitors may enter multiple classes, at the discretion of the match director, depending upon the total number of competitors that have registered for that shoot, by paying an additional entry fee for each class entered. Competitors who enter multiple classes must use a different rifle for each class entered that meets the requirement of said class.
- 5. The Unlimited and Precision classes will use American Rimfire Association Unlimited Class targets. The Sporter class will use American Rimfire Association Factory Class targets.
- 6. Competitors will have 20 minutes to shoot the 25 bulls on their target.
- 7. All targets will be scored using the rubric printed on the targets using a 100 point scale.
- 8. Each bullseye shot will give the competitor an X.
- 9. Each target will be scored by total points and the total number of X's.
- 10. Every competitor must fire at least one shot into one of the three sighters that are located along the top of every target. FAILURE TO SHOOT AT LEAST ONE SHOT INTO ONE OF THE SIGHTERS AT THE TOP OF THE TARGET AUTOMICALLY DISQUALIFIES THAT TARGET AND WILL RESULT IN A ZERO SCORE FOR THAT TARGET. Competitors can fire as many shots at any of the sighters as they wish.
- 11. First place prize will be awarded to the highest scoring target in each class when only a single target is shot or to the highest total score in competitions where the match director determines that there will be multiple targets shot.
- 12. Ties will be broken using the total number of X's. If there is still a tie it will be broken by using the order in which the X's are shot using the numbers on the individual bulls.
