Spring is a time of fresh starts and new beginnings. I remember when I was young, spring was a time that my mother took down all the curtains to wash and iron them, cleaning out the tracks and washing the windows before putting them back up. My dad would take the screens off the windows, spraying the dirt off them with a power washer, then washing the outsides of the windows before replacing the screens. The curtains smelled of sunshine and starch, and the windows and screens let in more light than before they were cleaned, giving the whole space an air of cleanliness and freshness that they didn't have before.

Spring cleaning is a big chore, but it has the power to refresh a space in ways that can be truly remarkable (especially if, like me, you maybe don't spring clean everything each year like my mother did!). The stale air that has been giving us cabin fever is flushed out, and the freshness of spring is invited in. It may be a lot of work, but it does bring joy to have that clean, open space ready for what the warm weather of spring and summer are about to bring.

It may seem far away, but we are less than a month from the onset of spring! March 20th is the first day of spring this year, and already the temperatures are warming and the sun is hitting with more force than it has for months. Gone are the days of leaving for work in the dark and coming home in the dark, as the sun stays with us longer each day. This year at Galilee we are going to reflect on Spring Cleaning as our theme for the Lenten season. "Lent" means "Spring," and as we head this year into the spring of our church year, we are going to consider the ways that our lives might be stagnant, or causing us to feel a bit of "cabin fever."

Each Sunday we will consider the God who cleanses our hearts from all sin and brokenness, creating in us clean hearts that live for God. We will ask for God to enter in with his cleansing fire and help us to clean out everything in our lives that pulls us away from God. Then on Wednesdays we will consider a different cleaning product and a related text that will help us reflect on the nature of purity and impurity, and how God might be working in us to forgive sin and move us to a more just and righteous way of being in God's world.

Spring cleaning can be difficult work, and some of the topics we touch on might be difficult for you to consider as well. But, as the fresh, clean feeling we get from spring cleaning can transform our homes, it is my hope that reflecting on the nature of God's purifying grace in our lives can transform our spiritual lives as well. I invite you to join us on this journey, and share in this time of reflection and purification. It is my prayer that as we reflect, God will enter our lives, creating in us clean hearts ready to love God and our neighbors with the love we have first received from God.
