PASTOR AMANDA APPLEHANS



"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it?

I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Isaiah 43:19

There is a particular joy that the new life of springtime brings. For so long our landscape has been so stark and vacant – the trees just sticks reaching into the sky, the grass brown and dead, the wind cold and cutting. But spring brings a newness, a freshness, to the world – the trees are beginning to have buds, the grass is greening, the flowers are poking through the dirt, and even when the wind blows it doesn't bite the way it has for months now.

Spring is a time of new beginnings, for the tress, for the flowers, and for us here at Galilee! In so many ways May brings new beginnings for our congregation. We are in the midst of the opening of a new chapter in Galilee's history. The mortgage we took on 25 years ago has been fulfilled – we will retire it officially on May 4th! We just celebrated the 1-year anniversary of my call to serve as your pastor, which takes us out of the "getting to know you" phase and brings us to a place of finding new ways to grow deeper together. We are starting a new season of the Pewaukee Farmers Market mid-month. We are preparing for a summer where we will again welcome counselors from Lutherdale to work with us to present a day camp for our elementary aged kids. So many new, fresh starts are coming to Galilee!

God is truly doing a new thing here! But I think it's fair to say that we don't know exactly what that will be just yet. We are working together to discern what God might be calling us to – evaluating the gifts God has given to us as a community and considering how those gifts might be best used to serve God's world. It's a big challenge, and one that will be done best with all of us working together.

I am excited to begin this work of discerning together where God might be gifting Galilee and calling us into the future. If you haven't had a chance to fill out the spiritual gifts inventory, or to assess your strengths using the StrengthsFinder assessment, let me know. I will make sure you have what you need to do that. If you have already done these assessments, recently or in the past, please share your results with me. A big first step to finding where God is calling us is to consider the gifts God has provided us. I would welcome a chance to know each of you deeper by chatting about the gifts God has woven into who you are, and considering together where God might be calling you to engage in the ministry opportunities here at Galilee, or maybe even to start something entirely new.

God is doing a new thing among us – I certainly can feel it, and I hope you can too. Please join me in praying for the new chapter that we are opening together, that God would work among us to carry our congregation in the ways that God would have us go.

Walking With Jesus:

Turns out it was quite a journey over the last 6 weeks from Lent to Easter Sunday! The ever present thorns of sin and despair are finally transformed into beautiful vines with flowers! Penny and I had planned this series of displays. But it soon turned into a much deeper walk of faith with Jesus for both of us. We discovered we weren't the only ones following this walk with Jesus as many of you joined us. Some studied each weekly scene for the changing details. Many asked questions and made comments. I got early morning texts of thankfulness. We stumbled into surprises, changes of plans and unexplained shopping trips along the way! For instance, this butterfly fluttered into the scene unannounced. It showed up right before holy week. BOOM....plans changed again. We were disturbed, comforted and eventually delighted as we all walked together on this emotional journey with Christ.



Sharing God's Love and Grace: "Why doesn't Jesus have a head?" Your engaging question from week one.

My first thought was this should be self-explanatory! Then I learned that even Penny didn't connect the dots as I saw them. I was humbled into realizing (once again) that my intent can be completely misunderstood. The last time I had to explain the intent of my art was in college trying to explain the pieces in my senior art exhibition! So I was compelled to try to explain this Jesus journey in writing via the e-news. Turns out it was another of God's plans. It really made me think deeper about the process and the vision of this Lent/Easter scene at Galilee. I couldn't just see it myself. I had to try to write it down so others might see it too! As God intended....I found myself sharing very personal revelations. I felt somewhat exposed to you all with my developing understanding of faith. I learned that sharing the how and why of these scenes brought all of us much deeper into spiritual and emotional connection to God. (And his Godhead is still there, front and center in all its Glory on Easter!)

Serving All Faithfully: So where do we go from here?

This is the end of our Worship in Arts journey for Lent & Easter. We really hope that like us, you have emerged inspired by this journey. Transformed. Renewed. Discovered something new about yourself and your faith. Several weeks ago a fellow Galilean shared his inspiring story of coming back to life after lifesaving measures. Two weeks ago in adult study, another of us told a story about miraculous healing and faith experienced by her father. Not everyone was able to see or hear these journeys and stories. My personal discovery is that visual worship displays can be spiritually deepened through the opening of my mind and heart to you all through writing and sharing. I have also been thinking about how we might serve each other more faithfully. One of you pointed me to the Monday April 21st article from Christ in Our Home. Paraphrased it says, "Boasting about Jesus is sharing how you have seen the power and love of Jesus at work in your

life." So let's continue to Walk, Share and Serve especially with each other! I will jump back in on occasion.

And I'm hoping you – YES YOU - will be inspired by this journey. Renewed and brave enough to share a story of a time when faith lifted you or someone you know up. What tough time have you gone through? What did you read that inspired you? Even the smallest thing can help someone else and certainly will deepen your own faith. Don't be afraid. Be Compelled!
