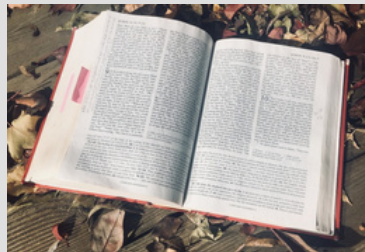

# Pewaukee Farmers Market

## More Than a Market Growing Community in Pewaukee



Every Wednesday afternoon, Galilee's upper parking lot becomes something different. Tents go up. Farmers unload fresh-picked corn and produce. Bakers arrange their treats, artisans display their work, musicians begin to play, and volunteers prepare to welcome visitors. Before long, the parking lot is filled with conversations, laughter and neighbors greeting one another. That may be one of the greatest impacts of the Pewaukee Farmers Market: it has become much more than a place to shop.

Local farmers and small businesses have an opportunity to introduce their products to hundreds of people, while new vendors join returning favorites. Nonprofit organizations share their missions. Musicians share their talents. Children stop for activities, volunteers welcome guests, and neighbors simply spend time together.

This summer, the market's reach has extended well beyond our parking lot. Brian Kramp of FOX6 visited in July and broadcast from the market, and TMJ4 meteorologist Lindsey Slater joined us for live broadcasts during the 4, 5 and 6 p.m. newscasts on August 12. Both visits provided wonderful opportunities to showcase the market, its vendors and the Pewaukee community to viewers throughout southeastern Wisconsin.

And week after week, people keep coming back.

We regularly welcome hundreds of visitors in a single afternoon, including 382 visitors on both August 12 and August 19, though our highest attended market was July 22 with 485. Some come for fresh corn or produce. Others come for a favorite vendor, a cold drink, music or dinner. Many stay because they run into someone they know—or meet someone new. That is community.

For Galilee, hosting the Pewaukee Farmers Market is also a way of living beyond the walls of our church. People who might never otherwise turn into our parking lot discover a place where they are welcomed, local businesses are supported and neighbors can simply spend time together.

The produce will eventually be eaten. The tents will come down. But the relationships being built each Wednesday may be the market's most lasting harvest.

# Landscape Refresh *Fundraiser*

## Renewing Galilee's front entry for beauty, function and long-term care

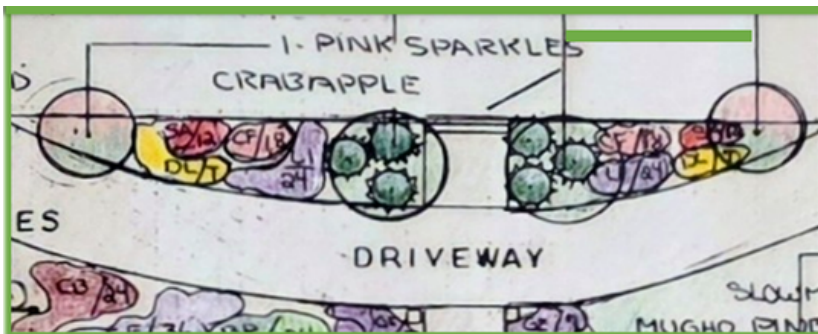
At last, God has blessed us with the right weather to move forward with the 2026 phase of the Front Entry Refresh Project! Over the last 25 years, our landscaping has aged, become overgrown and grown more challenging to maintain. During this multi-year project, the Landscape Team hopes to transform the entire front entry into a space that is more appealing, more functional and easier to care for.

### PHASE ONE: NOW THROUGH OCTOBER

Our 2026 focus is along the upper parking lot: a completely renewed bed by the front steps, tree removal/pruning/replacement, new steps, and improvements near the northeast emergency exit.

#### ALONG DRIVEWAY →

- Remove 4 pear trees at end of life
- Replace with 3 redbuds



#### ← BED #1: FRONT ENTRY BY STEPS

- Keep / prune serviceberries
- Remove yews, replace with dwarf mugos
- Move existing crab tree to firepit area
- Remove grass & amend soil
- Add 2 new Pink Sparkles Crabapples
- Dig, divide, and replant daylilies
- Add new perennials
- Mulch & water!!

Please take time to review plans in the narthex – and consider being a part of this exciting change through donations and volunteering a bit of time. Chat with the team – Penny, Tom, Nick and Karen after worship or anytime. Our goal is to fund the entire project with donations. Although we have a good start with past donations earmarked for this purpose, it's a big job! # Galilee *Partnerships*

## Walking Together

### Celebrating 20 Years of Partnership in El Salvador

For the last 20 years, Galilee has been in partnership with a small rural church in El Salvador. The church is named El Renacer de Los Mártires, which can be translated as “The Rebirth of the Martyrs.” It serves a small village commonly known as La Comunidad de Monseñor Romero.



Galilee members have traveled to El Salvador many times over the years. During those visits, we focus on building relationships and spending time with members of the local church community. We worship together, share meals, and celebrate together.

When we first arrive in the community, there is typically a great deal of excitement and celebration. Often, we are greeted by a local band playing celebratory music as we arrive.



### Walking Together Through An Accompaniment Model

Our relationship with our partner church in El Salvador is based on an “Accompaniment Model.” This means that we strive to create mutually respectful relationships. In short, we focus on building up the global church community. Our relationship is not meant to be a one-way street. We all benefit from knowing one another.

Many organizations emphasize building projects or gift-giving. These programs are certainly important, and while we do provide financial support to our partner church, we strive to do so in a way that demonstrates mutual respect and appreciation for the gifts that both communities bring to our partnership.

When a need is presented to us for possible financial support, we consider whether providing the requested support will strengthen our partnership and build up the church community. Often, this means supporting projects that improve the worship space at the local church.

For example, during one trip, we purchased paint supplies, and many of us picked up rollers and brushes to help local community members paint the inside and outside of their church building. Over the years, we have also provided funds to help construct a small corrugated-steel Sunday School building on the church property.

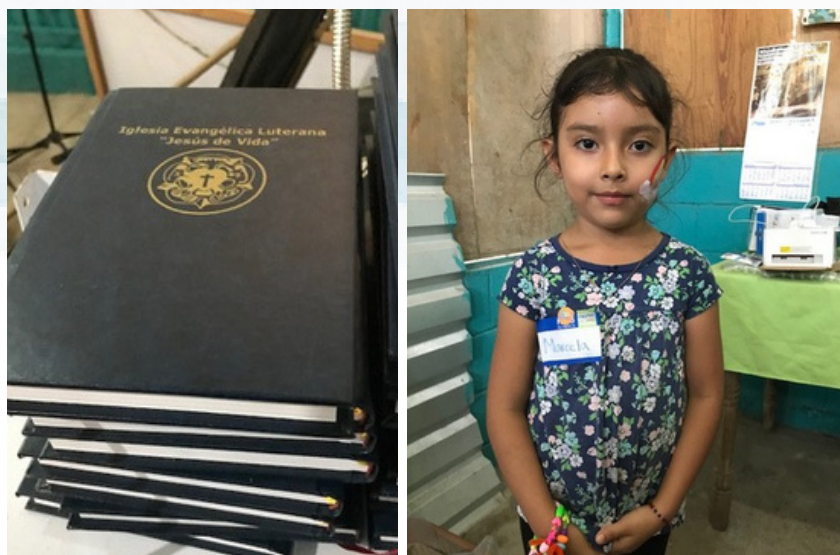
Each year, we also provide funds for backpacks filled with school supplies—and socks—that community children need for the upcoming school year. We help the local pastor purchase food, beverages, and small gifts to celebrate important holidays, including Mother's Day, which is especially important in El Salvador.

We have also helped the local pastor purchase new worship hymnals, provided a new church lectern, and helped tile the concrete floors inside the church. These are just a few examples of how we seek to accompany our partner church in El Salvador.

### More Than Financial Support

Some people assume that the most important thing we can provide to the local community in El Salvador is money. While sharing our financial gifts is certainly important, we believe it is even more important to do so in a way that builds relationships and strengthens a church partnership based on mutual appreciation and respect.

Those Galilee members who have traveled to El Salvador know that the local Salvadoran community offers at least as much, if not more, to this partnership than we do. One need only attend a community worship service in El Salvador to know that this is true.



During September, we will be taking financial donations to be used to purchase the school backpacks (including school supplies and new socks) for students in El Salvador. Thank you, as always, for your support.

# More Than Miles – Ride, Run, Walk

Galilee Goes the Distance for Outreach for Hope

*"It's what those miles make possible."*

On September 26, people from across the Greater Milwaukee Synod will lace up their shoes, climb on their bikes and head out for the annual Outreach for Hope Ride, Run, Walk.

**Galilee will be there.**

Already as of this writing, 24 members of our Galilee congregation have registered to ride, run, walk or raise funds even if they aren't able to participate in person. Galilee has supported this event for years, with participants including John McGroarty (our Galilee Liaison to the RRW), Carole Brinkman, Jean Nelson, Ann Dee Austin, and of course our own Pastor Amanda Applehans with her family as well as many others.

But the real story isn't how many miles the Galilee team travels on September 26.

## Where Do Those Miles Go?

Outreach for Hope walks alongside ministries serving communities experiencing material poverty throughout the Greater Milwaukee Synod. These ministries provide food, clothing, health care, spiritual care, programs for children and adults, and other resources. Just as importantly, they build relationships and become centers of hope within their neighborhoods.

The money raised through the Ride, Run, Walk helps provide grants that strengthen these ministries and allow them to respond to the needs they see every day. Sometimes that impact is remarkably tangible.

For example:

A ministry involving Hephatha Lutheran Church collects donated furniture and delivers it to families moving into housing. As the ministry grew, so did its need for space to store those donations. Outreach for Hope provided support that helped make storage space possible, allowing more donated furniture to reach neighbors who needed it.

Closer to Galilee's own story, Outreach for Hope has also highlighted Kim's Table, a ministry at our partner St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Milwaukee that provides clothing, a meal, and hygiene kits to those in need.

These are the kinds of ministries our miles help support.

## We Do More Together

Perhaps one of the most powerful things about Outreach for Hope is that no single congregation has to do it all alone.

Galilee joins congregations throughout the Greater Milwaukee Synod, each bringing what it can. One person walks. Another rides. Someone else runs. Someone who can't participate that day raises funds. A friend sponsors a participant. A congregation encourages a team. Those individual acts of generosity become something much larger when they are put together.

For Galilee, that means the impact of our ministry doesn't stop at our doors, or even at the Pewaukee city limits. When our neighbors are served, strengthened and reminded that they are not alone, Galilee has lived out our mission.
