Treasurer's Report:

2021 Budget Report

Ann Dee introduced and thanked Andrea Smith for her service especially during this time of the pandemic. Andrea started with pages 14 and 15 in the annual report giving a summary of 2021. She reviewed the giving and expenses for 2021.

There is one correction on page 14 MIF – Columbarium Care should be MIF – Endowment.

The mortgage is scheduled to be paid off in 2025.

Approval of the 2022 Budget

There were some changes made to the budget this past week.

The staff is getting a 4% increase this year. There was no increase given last year. There is a \$48,500 shortfall projected. The last 4 years we have had a projected shortfall and we have always met the needs. The Congregation steps up when needed.

A motion to approve the revised 2022 Budget was made by Al Burgemeister/Steve Dethloff. Motion carried.

Ann Dee thanked everyone for their financial support.

Elections:

Ann Dee asked for prayers for the new Leadership Board for 2022 and prayers of thanks for those who are completing their service.

1. Endowment Fund Committee

Want to nominate Diana Conway to join the Endowment Fund Committee. A motion to approve Dianna Conway to the Endowment Committee was made by Sally Ruf / Doug Dehler. Motion carried.

Vivian Dethloff gave a brief review of the Endowment Fund Committee. The fund was recently moved to a place that gives pays more interest. A question was asked on how you contribute to the Endowment Fund. People can give a direct donation and just designate the Endowment Fund and another way is through estate planning. Members are encouraged to donate especially with estate planning. There are guidelines of how the moneys are distributed. The principal stays and the interest is distributed yearly. It is not used for general maintenance at the church. The interest could not be used until the principal hit \$25,000.

2. Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee terms were changed during the 2021 Congregational meetings. The committee members will serve 2 year terms. We will be electing all 8 members for the coming year.

The year 2022 was a time of change and transition for our Galilee Community, but we were always able to see God's grace and love at work here in the life of Galilee. A special thank you to our members for their dedicated service to God and to the Community of Galilee. As you review the Coordinator's Ministry Reports, you can see the many and various ways that members have shared their time and talents to enhance our ministry.

2022 in Review:

The Leadership Board's focus for this year has been one of transition.

- ~The Leadership Board of 2022 consists of five board members; Ann Dee Austin, Jeff Dohlby, Terri Drover, Josh Prins, and Carl Spencer, with Andrea Smith as Treasurer. The Board meets at least one time a month. Oversight of the life of the Congregation in both worship and in financial property matters are responsibilities of the Board.
- ~Coordinators meet once a month to highlight their ministry area activities and to share how their ministry areas provide support for mission and ministry at Galilee. Several new members joined the role of Coordinator this past year. Administration—Nick Riegert; Compassion Care—Mary Jo Magnusson; Faith Formation—Stephanie Barth-Sunday School, Doug Dehler-Confirmation, Bill Braunschweig-Adult Education; Hospitality—Viv Dethloff; Worship & Arts—Diana Conway and Cori Ryta. Two new teams were added this year under the Administration Ministry, Communications (Debra Kohler) and Technology (Ron DeBlaey).

We welcome and thank them for saying "yes"!

- ~With learning of the retirement of Pastor Jay Ford in February of 2022, preparation began for his departure. Galilee provided a celebration of his 40 Years in the Ministry with Word and reception on July 31st, 2022. (Special thanks to Marilyn Lindemeyer for organizing the reception.)
- ~The Welcome Refresh Project was proposed and completed in July due to the generous financial support from the Congregation! The project involved changing our entrance lobby to become a more welcoming place of Worship and upgrading facility projects.

 (A special thank you to Karen Buelow, Penny Van Weele and Bill Rudolph for all of their help.)
- ~Covid protocols were reviewed; A separate section was created for a masked area in the Sanctuary, offering plates were again passed, and Communion wafers were now given to those who received communion.
- ~In the months of August, September, October, and November we were blessed by several pulpit supply pastors. And our own Galilean Pastors (Karen Klatt, Jim Olia and David Keller) shared their talents with us as they officiated services.
- ~Pastor Jennifer Arnold began her interim ministry at Galilee on November 12th, 2022. Pastor Jennifer has many gifts to offer us as she provides guidance as we move through this transitional time. Due to the long distance Pastor Jennifer travels, Pastor Roy Nelson has agreed to officiate on two Saturdays a month. We are blessed to have him lead our worship.

~Our staff, Shoniqua Reik (Administrative Assistant) and Karen Streit (Financial Administrator), Patricia DeBlaey (Director of Music), Mary Kay Debrecht (Sunday accompanist), and Jean Nelson (Director of Children, Youth & Family Ministry) have done an outstanding job this past year. Many times each person took on extra responsibilities to facilitate ministry and worship in the absence of a full time pastor. We are grateful for their service!

Moving into 2023:

- ~The Leadership Board, Coordinators, and Treasurer have prepared a 2023 Budget for Mission & MInistry which is included in this annual report. The Leadership Board recommends that the Congregation review and approve the 2023 Budget.
- ~The Congregation will be taking steps forward in our transition process beginning by forming a MET (Mission, Exploration, Team) The MET will guide the Congregation through a process of exploration and discernment about its mission and the kind of pastor needed in the next chapter of Galilee's ministry.
- ~A Congregational Vitality Survey will also be used to gather data on our ministry. Members will be able to share their insights.
- ~Steve Dethloff and Cori Ryta were elected at the October Congregational meeting to serve on the Leadership Board, replacing Ann Dee Austin and Jeff Dohlby.
- ~The Leadership Board is proposing to add a Finance team under our Administration Coordinator Ministry. These members would support Karen Streit-(Financial Administrator) and Andrea Smith-(Treasurer).
- ~A grant has been secured to provide funds for expanding our digital presence. This will allow Galilee to reach out to share God's message to more people in all places.
- ~Looking ahead, the Leadership Board has begun exploring the cost of a new roof for our facility; a new roof will be needed.

The changes and transitions will continue in the new year but with God's guidance and the empowerment of the Holy Spirit Galilee will continue to carry out the ministry of the church.

Thank You:

I have been truly humbled by the support and care I have received from my sisters and brothers here at Galilee over the past four years on the Leadership Board. It has been an honor to serve in ministry with you!

Galilee is blessed to have dedicated, faithful, and capable members on the 2023 Leadership Board. The skills they bring with them will help provide leadership and vitality to the service of God as they support the Congregation in this time of transition and the beginning of a new chapter in the life of Galilee.

May we, as the Community of Galilee, continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to guide, empower, and enlighten us as we continue the ministry here and throughout the World.

It has been my privilege to join you in ministry at Galilee as your Interim Pastor. I began my ministry on November 7th and your welcome to me has been wonderful. Thank you!

In my short time with you up, here are a few observations:

- •Galilee has a lovely worshipping community with wonderful music and lay leadership. The visual arts in the sanctuary and around the building proclaim that you appreciate beauty and choose to use it to enhance the sharing of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- •You care deeply for one another. Through Compassion Care, in your prayer life, and in your weekly interactions I know this is a place where people matter.
- •The organizational structure here seeks to empower lay leaders in sharing their gifts and in guiding and carrying out ministry. We will seek to strengthen this further during my time with you.
- •You live out a commitment to Jesus Christ beyond our walls through partnerships locally and internationally.
- •You are experiencing many of the things that other congregations are seeing: changed worship patterns and a need to review and renew the mission of the church.

I look forward to our ministry together in 2023 as we move through the pastoral transition process. Early in 2023 the Leadership Board will appoint the Mission Exploration Team or METeam; this group will be our guide as we explore who we are, how God is calling us to serve in the next chapter of ministry, and what kind of pastoral leader we need to accompany us. At the conclusion of the MET process, we will submit our ELCA *Ministry Site Profile (MSP)*.

The MSP document has three audiences:

- 1.Our call committee will use it as the lens through which it interviews and discerns pastoral candidates for Galilee;
- 2. The synod will search for potential candidates based on what the MSP says; and
- 3.It will be the first way that potential candidates learn about Galilee and begin to discern whether they are interested in interviewing for call here.

Please watch for the many opportunities to engage in our mission exploration process. Your wisdom, input, and discernment will be essential as we learn from one another, from our community, and from the Holy Spirit.

For the year ended December 31, 2021 and 2022

NOTE 1—Affiliation and Tax-Exempt Status

Galilee Lutheran Church located in Pewaukee, Wisconsin, was organized in 1954 as a member of the United Evangelical Lutheran Church, joined the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) in 1983, and is now a member congregation of the Greater Milwaukee Synod of the ELCA. The Church is tax-exempt under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

NOTE 2—Unaudited Financial Statements

Galilee's financial statements and accounting records have not been subject to an independent audit by a Certified Public Accountant. Previous statements, procedures and accounting records have been periodically reviewed by Galilee's internal audit committee. The most recent audit was completed for calendar years 2019 and 2020. To date, based on their findings, the committee has not recommended spending the additional cost for an outside independent audit.

NOTE 3—Restricted Cash

Partnering with families to help kids know, love, and follow Jesus is our mission. This applies to kids of all ages, including adults!

Sunday School

We were back in full swing in Fall 2022 with three classes: PreK-Kindergarten, grades 1-2, and grades 3-6. Leaders for Fall 2022 include: Stephanie Barth, Kristen Greig, Cheryl Hanson, Terri Hofstede, Jill Plesh, Kathy Hyslop, CJ Knutson, Penny Van Weele, Darrin Kehl, Dennis Olson, and Mary Winter. Twenty-two children from 14 families were enrolled. Grades 1-6 continue to use the Whirl Lectionary curriculum. The PreK-K class switched to lessons from the Frolic Preschool curriculum.

Highlights from the year include:

- An intergenerational #A-O-K Day (Acts of Kindness) on February 6 when we created Valentine cards for our seniors and college students
- An intergenerational Lenten Walk through the life of Jesus, from birth to burial, on Palm Sunday, April 10. Sunday School and Confirmation kids helped create the scenes, a team of volunteers served as tour guides and site monitors, and between 80-90 people participated in the walk.

Confirmation Ministry

Galilee celebrated the rite of Affirmation of Baptism/Confirmation for two students in 2022: Maddison Connolly on June 4 and Estella Levas on October 30. The Confirmation group continues to meet on Sunday mornings during the education hour, beginning with 15 minutes of music time. May saw the completion of a year-long look at the New Testament; this fall we began working through the Old Testament. Our faithful leaders are Diana Conway, Doug Dehler, Kim Kiser, Tom Reinke, and Jean Nelson. Confirmation kids enjoyed a few Saturday evenings of fun and fellowship at church, including a pizza and game night and a time to create scenery for the Lenten Walk. We hope to continue these gatherings in 2023. The group requested that the youth room be repainted. Mitchell Smith completed the job as a service project for school, with assistance from his dad, Craig. In May, four students helped members of our Prayer Shawl ministry group tie fleece blankets for our 2022 high school graduates, with several family members joining in; a pizza lunch was enjoyed by all. Several students also participated in the Thanksgiving service project in November at the Event to be Named Later.

Youth Ministry

We had 2-14 children per Sunday, plus storyteller and assistants. Our Godly Play room was full of excitement, learning, and wonder, with several new children participating and some of our previous children moving on to become helpers. We have been blessed this year with a few returning story tellers and a new group of story tellers and helpers! Thank you to all who responded to bring back this valuable part of worship. Our weekly stories give us that kind of place, a space of peace, acceptance, and wonder with God. Of course, there is always room for more! In the coming year, Godly Play will need more adults and teens to serve as helpers, storytellers, organizers, and crafters. We are planning to organize and label our story baskets and update pieces in some of the stories so they don't need to share pieces. In general we want to make access to the story pieces easier for the organizer and the story teller and the children. The best way to support our programs is even easier than telling a story or attending a class: take just a few minutes to interact with the kids in church. Listen to them share the story at the Godly Play table after service. Ask what they learned about in Sunday school. Smile as they carry buckets for Noisy Offering. Thank them for serving in church. It's these little changes to our routines that really have the power to transform our lives and the lives of our children to ones of promised peace. ~Sue Olson

Activity and accomplishments during 2022

Galilee members continued their support of outreach to those in need and help improve their lives. This support involved monetary gifts and donations as well as personal time, talents, gifts and abilities. Through awareness, teaching and involvement; our children, young people, parents and adults became aware of the needs in the community, the country and globally.

We are always seeking more Galilee members to be involved in current, as well as drive, new initiatives for the Partnership areas at Galilee along with educating the Congregation as to what is available and how to become involved. Currently we are in search of a new <u>Coordinator</u> and champions of the entities listed below with (vacancy) appended. Our Partnerships are sustained and will grow with the support and interest of the Congregation. This support includes prayers, active participation in activities and events, monetary and item contributions for projects we wish to engage in and ideas and suggestions to grow the ministry areas. Below are many ways Galilee members participated in activities over the last year:

Lutherdale Bible Camp (vacancy) – We had no events with the camp due to COVID. Small group and family camping is being considered for the future to provide new connections with their ministry outreach.

Lutheran Program for the Aging at Luther Manor — Galilee members support Luther Manor through a donation to the Auxiliary. Volunteers are needed to visit residents, donate and help out when needed.

ELCA Greater Milwaukee Synod (vacancy) – Financial commitments support the mission and ministry we share beyond our own congregation. We have Galilee members participate in workshops and activities offered to network, learn and share ideas. A donation of \$1,000 went for Hunger Relief in Tanzania this year.

Lutheran Social Services (vacancy) - Individualized opportunities for volunteering and donations will be researched for future promotion and engagement by the congregation.

Lutheran World Relief (Carole Brinkman) – Galilee was not active this year due to COVID restrictions. The plan for 2023 is to get working again to provide Personal Kits, School Kits, Quilts and Baby Kits for this wonderful outreach ministry.

Tanzania Partnership (Deb Kohler) – Galilee continues to accompany our sister Parish, Ndoombo, and the Diocese of Meru in Tanzania. Galilee is represented at the monthly Greater Milwaukee Synod partnership meetings and continues to include prayers for our partnership during worship every weekend. Additionally, we continue to support the Mt. Meru Coffee Project that supports fair trade for farmers in Tanzania.

El Salvador (Barb Barthel)

Card Ministry – Thinking of You/Praying for You" cards are sent out to congregation members that are on the prayer list. Cradle roll cards are sent out twice a year to baptized babies until their third birthday. Krista Olia has been hand-making beautiful cards for some of the holidays. (Linda Kowalewski, Coordinator)

Loss and Living Ministry – This ministry resumed in November 2022 on the third Thursday of each month. This gathering is not limited to the loss of a loved one but includes any loss that affects us emotionally or physically. (Barb Barthel, Coordinator)

Healing Prayer Ministry – This ministry resumed in August 2021 and is currently offered during Holy Communion at Saturday and Sunday Services on the 1st weekend of each month. Trained volunteers commit to praying for parishioners along with the laying on of hands and anointing with blessed oil. (Krista Olia - Coordinator)

Prayer Chain Ministries – This is a ministry that provides prayers for Galilee members that have a need for healing whether for themselves, family, friends etc. It's a confidential prayer chain that once the office is notified of a prayer request, the request is sent to the coordinator and in turn she/he sends it to the Galilee members that have volunteered to be prayers for this as well as the Pastor. This is a behind the scenes ministry that means so much to our members. (Mary Stauber – Coordinator)

Eucharistic Ministry Team – Ministry team bringing the sacrament of Holy Communion to Galilee homebound members. Orientation was provided by Pastor Jay. The goal is for the team of volunteers to visit all homebound members requesting communion once every 30 to 60 days. The team is always welcome to additional volunteers. (Kim Kiser – Coordinator)

Freezer Meal Ministries – This is a joint ministry with Hospitality utilizing Galilees kitchen to prepare and freeze meals for Galilee members to share with anyone in need of a meal at any time. Meals are stored in the freezer in the kitchen. (Mary Stauber – Co-coordinator with Susan Keller)

Created with Love Ministry (formerly Prayer Shawl Ministry/Knitting Group)— This Ministry continues to find ways to reach out to show God's love to all through crafted projects (knitting, crocheting and sewing). The projects include creating Prayer Shawls, making caps for infants and cancer patients and knitting infusion arm bands. The members sew cloth bags and knit dish clothes for the Food Pantry. These are just some of the items that are included in the ministry's project list. Members meet to work on projects the third Monday of the month.
