PASTOR AMANDA APPLEHANS



I write to you today from the past - I am currently preparing to leave for Tanzania in a few days, and I will have been gone for a week or so when this goes out to you. Epiphany is a wonderful time for a trip like the one I am taking. During the Epiphany season we read stories that help us have "epiphanies" about who Jesus was in his day, and who Jesus is in our world today.

One thing we notice when we look at the stories of Jesus in scripture is how many people from other nations come to Jesus. In Matthew some of the first to know of Jesus's birth and understand its importance are magi, who traveled many months to find the child whose start they saw at its rising, and to pay homage to the new king.

Jesus will be challenged by the Syrophonecian woman, who helps Jesus to see and meet the needs of people from all around the world. Then just before his crucifixion, Jesus knows his time is coming when he sees Gentiles from foreign lands. Even though Jesus came to earth to be the King of the Jews, he was always also the Savior of the Nations.

Today, there are Christians in almost every nation in the world. The church looks very different in different places, but there are people on every inhabited land mass who are part of the Christian faith. There is nowhere we can go where God is not already there, ready to meet us in our brothers and sisters.

I love Paul's metaphor of the church as body of Christ, which you will read during worship while I am gone. I would suggest that, if we are speaking of the church as the body of Christ, then missionaries would be the blood of the body. Traveling around the body from place to place, bringing prayers and stories of brothers and sisters around the world, sharing the things that feed faith in one place with those who might benefit from those thoughts in another place, and nourishing the whole body with the knowledge that none of them are alone. It is my hope that we can nourish the church in Meru with stores of their brothers and sisters in Wisconsin, and when we get back nourish the church at Galilee with stories of their brothers and sisters at Ndoombo.

I appreciate your prayers during my time away. A big thank you to all those who are picking up tasks I usually cover during the trip, and to those who have offered help to Grant and Sam. I am excited to share our stories with the Tanzanian Christians, and I look forward to bringing home stories to share with you about those who love Christ halfway around the world. Take good care, and I look forward to seeing you all as February unfolds!



FEBRUARY IS HEART HEALTH MONTH

Learn CPR & be equipped to save a life!

Do you know CPR? (cardiopulmonary resuscitation)

or how to use an AED? (Automated External Defibrillator) Learning these skills could help save a life -The life you save may be someone you know!

Why should I learn CPR?

Learning CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) is crucial because it equips you with the skills to potentially save a life during a cardiac arrest or other life-threatening emergencies.

CPR can significantly increase the chances of survival from sudden cardiac arrest.

If CPR is performed immediately, it can double or triple the chances of survival.

Why is CPR important?

After the heart stops pumping, brain death can start to occur within 4 minutes. The chances of survival is greatly increased by giving CPR within the first 2 minutes. 80% of cardiac arrests occur at home.

This instructor led, lay-friendly course is about 3 hours in length. There is a series of step by step videos followed by hands-on manikin practice. The goal is to have each participant feel comfortable delivering the steps of quality CPR. There is No Test. \$35 course fee - includes course booklet given out in your class.

This is not a certification course. If certification is needed that can be arranged through Advanced Professional Healthcare Education LLC-Delafield (APHE) is an American Heart Authorized Training Center and will provide our training.


Galilee's Adult Forums follow the Sunday morning worship services from 10:15 to 11:15. Please plan to attend these sessions and bring your Bible and a friend!






