## **PASTOR AMANDA APPLEHANS**





Fall is my favorite season of the year. As I write this to you in late October, the trees are awash in gorgeous color – reds, yellows, oranges, purples all surround us. But, every morning there are more leaves on the ground than there were the day before, and we are beginning to see the bare branches of certain trees as they prepare for the winter months that will soon be upon us.

But, as the boisterous life of summer gives way to the barren branches of winter, we get to witness the joy of letting go. Trees that have received life all summer long from the hardworking chlorophyll in their leaves are beginning the process of letting those leaves go. Dear Frineds at Galilee Lutheran Church:

Share Our Best Furniture Ministry launched four years ago as a partnership between Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Menomonee Falls and Hephatha Lutheran Church in Milwaukee. The ministry slowly began to grow, with enough furniture donations coming in to necessitate storage space and delivery vehicles. For these, Share Our Best's Andy Dederich approached Outreach for Hope, an initiative of the Greater Milwaukee Synod that raises and distributes funds to ministries helping those in need

"We came up with support funds that could help them rent a storage facility," said Chris Manke, executive director of Outreach for Hope. "The Greater Milwaukee Synod also did a campaign called Equipping the Saints, which raised funds for various ministries, and knew supporting this collaboration between Hephatha and Holy Cross would be a perfect fit." Dederich said that as the need for furnishings grows, Share Our Best is looking at ways to scale its operation. That means not only more furnishings out also space to store the pieces until lithey can be delivered, and whichies and manpower to make those deliveries, furnit then, Dederich said, he and his team will continue working with their partners, including Outreach for Hope, to furnish as many homes as possible and demonstrate the power of God's love to change lives in ways great and small.

"It has really been about creating the connections between churches and people," he said. "And it's amazing what good things can be done when those connections are made." [Excerpted from The Living Lutheran, Fall 2025]



#### NAMING OUR BLESSINGS ONE BY ONE

Help fill the water droplets in the fountain by naming your blessings.

 Think of small and specific blessings each day, rather than general blessings like good health and family.

Suggestions: seeing a beautiful sunset, an unexpected call from a friend, a day without knee pain, etc.

- Write the blessing on a paper drop of water from the basket and attach it to a strand of water. You can write on multiple drops over the next few weeks.
- Why? To cultivate greater awareness of God's daily blessings, especially the small ones we might not typically notice. Greater awareness and naming our blessings leads to increased gratitude and joy.
- The goal is to have a fountain filled and overflowing with everyday blessings.



## Morgan Barker Confirmation Day

"I believe that my faith in God is strong. The verse that best describes His presence in my life is from Hebrews 13:8 - "I know that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." This verse shows that Jesus never changes and will never leave me. I have changed, though, from when I first went to Sunday School as a young child to now, getting confirmed. At first, I thought that faith was just about loving God and that's it. But I've learned over time that faith is much more. I believe now that faith is not just loving God, but trusting Him to guide me, praying to Him, and following his Word. It is comforting to me knowing that God will always be there for me and will never change.

A time when I felt very close to God was when I was studying the Bible for Confirmation. My favorite Bible story was Moses and the 10 plagues. God guided Moses and his people out of slavery in Egypt. In the same way, God guides me away from bad choices and toward good ones. Another time I feel God's support and love is when I excel in sports and school. I like playing hockey and have been successful in past years. I know I can go to God with a problem and He will listen. Sometimes, though, God can feel far away. An example is when I hear about all the wars going on in the world. When I first heard about the war in Israel, I was sad because I don't like seeing people fight and die. It is hard to see God's light because lots of innocent people, including children, were dying. But I know that even when things are bad, my faith lets me know that God will always be there for me.

My faith has changed over the years and has just gotten stronger. Now, I perceive God as a kind and caring Father. I will take His lessons that I've learned and strive to be a kind, caring, and giving person. I strongly believe that Jesus never changes and will be with me forever. I AM a child of God."

## **November 1-2<sup>nd</sup> – Community (All Saints' Sunday)**

As we celebrate All Saints' we remember the whole cloud of witnesses that surrounds us. At the table of Holy Communion we feast with all those who have gone before us, all those who have contributed to our faith and are still with us in this world, and truly with all the saints in every time and every place who receive the body and blood of Christ. Today we will immerse ourselves in the unity that comes from being a part of this Body.

**November 8-9<sup>th</sup> -** We worship on the first day of the week because Jesus was raised on that day. Every Sunday is a little Easter. This Sunday feels more like Easter than many as the appointed texts celebrate the reality of the resurrection. Live it up this Lord's day. Our God is the God of the living.

**November 15-16**<sup>th</sup> - Jeremiah's promise of the execution of "justice and righteousness in the land" finds ironic fulfillment in the execution of Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews. It appears utterly contradictory that a king should be crucified with a criminal. This victory appears for all the world as humiliating defeat. Yet through the gate of death Jesus opens the door to paradise.

**November 22-23<sup>rd</sup> -** Every gathering for worship has elements of thanksgiving. When we are nourished with God's bounty in holy communion, when we partake of Jesus' word that gives life to the world, and even when two or three of us simply join our hearts in prayer to make our requests known to God, we do so "with thanksgiving." Let us give thanks to God, who is good and whose mercy endures forever. This year at Galilee our Thanksgiving Worship Service will be on Sunday, November 23<sup>rd</sup>. Following worship will be our traditional pie social. We invite everyone to join in, and bring a pie or treat to share, if you wish. There will be no Sunday School on this date.
