# PASTOR AMANDA APPLEHANS



Dear Galileans,

As we pass the half-way point in our Lenten season and begin to approach the Holy Week where we remember the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Lord, I can't help but reflect on how much death we have had in our community in the last six months. When I count up the members and those closely associated with our members who have passed on, we are over 10 people since September, most of whom have passed in this calendar year.

Grief, and how we as Christians grieve those we have lost, is an appropriate topic for us during this later part of our Lenten season. There is much for us to learn from the disciples and their response to the death and resurrection of Jesus.

The disciples had no expectation of Jesus coming back after the cross. On the cross all their hopes and dreams for who Jesus could be and what Jesus could do died. His last breath was the end of their expectations. Even though he told them he would die and come back – they did not have the expectation of his resurrection. We see this in Luke 24 story of the disciples journeying to Emmaus on Easter evening. They had heard Jesus's predictions of his resurrection, they had heard the women's reports of the empty tomb, and still, as they spoke with Jesus (who they didn't yet recognize as Jesus) about the things that had happened to Jesus in Jerusalem that week they said, "But we had hoped he was the one to redeem Israel." "But we had hoped..." To me these are some of the saddest words in all of scripture. The longing and grief contained in those words is immense. We had hopes for what life would hold, but this death has crushed those hopes. How many of us haven't been in this place? Our hopes and plans for how life could be crushed because death has visited. Ultimately Jesus reveals himself to these travelers, and they rush back to Jerusalem to share

their encounter with Jesus. Hope is no longer dead, it has been given new life! And not just for

them but for the whole community, as when they return they hear the story of Peter's encounter with the risen Christ. Jesus is risen, and with this resurrection comes the resurrection of all the hopes and dreams that the disciples had for who Jesus could be for them and for our world.

Now we live in a world where the belief in new, resurrected life is a real thing. We live with the possibilities of eternal life with Christ, even as we live in a world that still deals with death. We live in a world where we must deal with the contradiction of the reality of death and the assurance of eternal life beyond the grave. And while living with a contradiction sounds like a bad thing, this contradiction is one that frees us on both ends. Because of our acceptance of the reality of death we can grieve the loss of one we love so much, and be sad because of the separation we now face. And because of our hope in Christ we can entrust the one we love to the care of Christ, knowing that our separation will one day end when we are reunited in eternity.

In First Thessalonians, Paul refers to this reality as "not grieving as others do, who have no hope." We do grieve, but we grieve not as those whose hope is dead, but we grieve as those who have the hope of eternal reunion with those we have loved in the eternal kingdom of our God. We grieve as those who still have hope. May we all work together to support one another as we continue to grieve our losses, and celebrate our joys, as those who have hope in the promise of eternal life with Christ.




#### **Interfaith Concert**



#### Discover your spiritual gifts

Spiritual gifts - what's that?

Spiritual gifts are special attributes given to us by the Holy Spirit. You can think of them as your spiritual DNA. Each person's mix of spiritual gifts is unique.

What are spiritual gifts for?

Our gifts enable us to serve in the body of Christ (aka Galilee Lutheran) with joy and satisfaction. They are designed to be shared - to further God's kingdom in the world, to glorify God, and to build up the body of Christ.

How do I know what my gifts are?

Take a spiritual gifts inventory. This involves responding to a series of questions by circling the response that most closely matches how you perceive yourself - very true of me, frequently true of me, sometimes, infrequently, or rarely true of me. There are no wrong answers. Fill out the scoring grid to determine your strongest gifts.

What's next?

Copies of the spiritual gifts inventory are available on the table in the narthex. Along with the inventory is a follow up sheet. Please fill out this form and put it in the box on the table or return it to the church office.

Why does Galilee need to know what my gifts are?

"If we truly believe that people are given gifts for the good of all believers, then there is no such thing as a volunteer; there is only the invitation to disciples to use their gifts.... God created and calls each person to make a difference. Discover how a gifts-based ministry can revitalize your congregation and engage everyone, regardless of age, to be the community of Christ." 

The Wisconsin Council of Churches Joint Statement: For Religious Liberty and Against Christian Nationalism

On March 11, 2025, faith leaders from Wisconsin, including Greater Milwaukee Synod Bishop Paul Erickson, released a joint statement to address the February 6th United States of America presidential executive order to establish a new "Task Force to Eradicate Anti-Christian Bias". It reads in part: This task force has the duty to "identify any unlawful anti-Christian policies, practices, or conduct by an agency". This executive order is a threat to the religious pluralism enshrined in the constitution and does not protect Christians; rather it aligns the federal government with Christian Nationalism.
