ADVENTURE CLASS DESCRIPTION/COST

Adventure Class is a two-semester commitment that focuses on the planning, itinerating, and executing of an international or national trip.

The primary objectives of AC are as follows:

- Jesus To learn that every adventure, no matter the size or destination, is a time to love like Jesus and walk where He leads.
- Adventure To learn the fundamentals of who we are, what adventure is, and how we can carry the spirit of adventure forward into the rest of our lives.
- Travel To learn the logistics of travel, including (but not limited to): booking flights/lodging/transportation/events, researching destinations/language/culture, budgeting for every level, safety (self-defense/wisdom/preparation), teamwork/dynamics...etc.

The locations vary based on the needs/input of the class and combined costs. The trip usually ranges from 8-21 days and takes place somewhere between the beginning of March and the end of June. Although we will do our best to finalize travel plans as early as possible, be forewarned that this is not a guarantee. We have had as little as two weeks' notice of a major travel change in the past, and have often only decided upon the final plan roughly 2-3 months prior to departure.



Cost: Here are some examples of past trip costs to give you an idea. All prices are before any personal expenses (souvenirs, food outside of normal budget...etc.)

- \$1,500 14 Days in Italy
- \$2,000 19 Days Around the U.S.A
- \$1,500 20 Days on Route 66



A class Discord will be set up for the team. Participation in this is crucial for information sharing and quick travel decisions.



On top of the cost of the primary adventure, day/overnight trips are sometimes offered during the rest of the year. These trips are completely optional.* The cost will typically range from \$25-\$200 per trip and go a long way in building the team dynamic.

*On certain years, \$150 is due the first day of class for a two-night trip to Redding, CA in February for the Festival of Cultures.
