How does the Boys 2 MEN/Girls 2 Women program work? It works by establishing vibrant, Boys 2 MEN/Girls 2 Women clubs on university and junior college campuses across America. These clubs can range from 15 to 100 members or more. These excited, motivated, fierce groups of college students become like little armies. Their marching orders are to penetrate and infiltrate local elementary and secondary schools and un-

earth children who have Fallen Through the Cracks (FTC). Once FTC children are identified a Boys2MEN/-Girls2Women Mentoring/Tutoring Club is established on that school campus, and each FTC child is then incubated, nurtured, tutored and inspired towards greatness.



How are children referred?

Children are referred by their teachers, office managers, principals, social workers, foster care agencies and family members.

Once we explain to the schools about our goal of reaching out to FTC students, the school administrators generally waste no time in developing lists, since these FTC children are quite easy to identify.



Where do the children come from? Most FTC children are no different from any other child and come

from all over. Although most live in single-parent homes, not all of them are poor or disadvantaged. Though they may have families that love and care for them, having a highly motivated, productive college kid in their life literally strengthens them socially and academically.

How do I become involved

There are three (3) ways to take part — by giving one or all of what we call the three "Tees." **TIME...TALENT...TREASURES**

- TIME** - Countless volunteer opportunities are always available.
- TALENT** - Do you sing, dance, play instruments, knit, build model cars, etc. You're welcome.

Purpose

The Boys 2 MEN/Girls 2 Women Foundation is a non-profit organization developed to serve the community by assisting children from 2 to 18 years of age in becoming productive members of society by instilling positive, spiritual, cultural, educational, vocational and social values. We do this by fulfilling the following functions:



Mentoring

We start by partnering with universities, colleges and junior colleges by establishing federal work studies contracts in order to recruit, hire and train students to infiltrate the elementary and secondary schools surrounding the colleges.



Educational

These students will examine the elementary and secondary schools while following all the procedures required in order to become legal volunteers with the districts. Once the college studies students become legal volunteers, their goal will be to identify what Boys 2 MEN/-Girls 2 Women calls "Falling Through the Crack" (FTC) children. It is well-documented that the prison industry can determine the number of beds it will need in the future by looking at the current third-grade reading level.

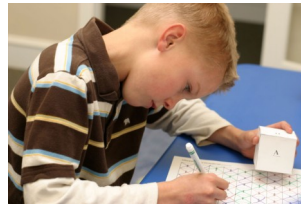


Study: Third-grade reading level indicates a student's chances of graduating high school.

College Students' Mission

Once our college students become legal volunteers and identify FTC children, mentoring/tutoring through a free after-school program will be established on or near the children's campus, utilizing campus classrooms, cafeterias or libraries. Off-campus libraries and community centers are an option, as well.



Mentoring/Tutoring

B2M/G2W will work with children to establish weekly progress reports as they are tutored two to three days per week. Each FTC child will be assigned a mentor who will incubate, encourage and tutor the child throughout the school year. Never to leave them alone again.
