Interview with Mark Perkins...

We've known each other for many years, and during that time we have seen many changes in the world around us. Is the UK still the "Christian country" that some people would have us believe? And is this widely held view a psychological barrier Finally, what book are you reading at the moment, or have to talking to folk about Jesus Christ?

below Biblical standards. So their view is a barrier;, as so many believe they Inspiring! And they are personal friends of mine. are 'Christian'. Christianity, to them, is defined as having material blessings, having good morals, and being baptised/christened.

You have always been a bit of a health freak (compared with many of us!); you enjoy sports like squash and basketball, you cycle daily, and you eat (generally) healthily. Does a healthy lifestyle help you in your Christian life? If so, why?

Yes! Being energised to serve God. Rising early to exercise and spend time with God. Physical and spiritual exercise work together to strengthen me for 'Service', and guard me against temptation…and that helps maintain the joy in the Lord. When I am not healthy, I have less energy to rise early and spend time with God, so then I am weakened against temptation.

It is no secret that your personal life has been hit by issues that we, as Christians, think only happens to others. And many of us can relate to some of the stresses that the pandemic has caused us. In such times, there are always those who will want to 'cast stones'. How have you been coping? Has it made you question God, and doubt His love and care? Or, maybe, in such times do we grasp His love and care more closely?

Dbviously, people respond in different ways. Praise God... He called me unto Himself. I've spent loads of time immersed in the Bible, in prayer, • praise, and in listening to sermons and reading good Christian books. God has faithfully revealed himself to me... His presence, promise and power. God also disciplined me, guided me, and gave me peace and joy! • However, I must keep connected to Him through His Word, through the prayer and obedience, because Satan tempts me to think vengeful and . hateful thoughts, and to worry. Although I may have lost many worldly • comforts, relationships and friendships, I have gained such a deep appreciation for eternal things, Jesus, and the Gospel!

Sometimes when things don't work out the way we want them to, we can turn in on ourselves and say "I've failed". How do we deal with these circumstantial hiccups. Our human frailties say "Give up, and walk away", but what should we do?

Admit we have failed, or have been failed. Then, immediately turn to God in confessional prayer. Turn to His Word... and read it, believe it, obey it. • Allow God to remind us of His sovereign, loving control. Set our minds on things above — above this fallen world where emotions and circumstances can drain us.

Where do you, as a friend and fellow Christian, see the future for The Good Shepherd Fellowship? Has God finished with us, or do you believe there is more to come?

There's more to come! God is faithful. As the Fellowship faithfully submits , to God, He will guide and use and bless. Leadership is vital to any organisation, and the GSF has good leadership, headed by Graham, Your pastor is a faithful, God-dependent servant, and the Fellowship follows. that lead... so...therefore...more to come! The future will not look like the past, but I am confident it will be a future of love, service, fellowship and truth! Perhaps a lot more daily, one-to-one service, which would be very. much needed and appreciated in an increasingly lonely, frustrated, hateful, divided world.
