September Board Meeting

The following topics were discussed:

244 E 10th St. The board met with the new owners & architects of the empty lot at 10th & Alabama to discuss conceptual drawings for the single-family home to be constructed. (*Note: More details will be shared when plans are formalized & ready for IHPC.*)

Traffic Safety. Proposals from neighbors along Alabama were reviewed, regarding safety concerns at the 4-way stop at St. Joseph Street. The board supported the need to review the issue and will be coordinating with city officials to determine appropriate next steps in advance of the neighborhood meeting.

Hospitality Committee. The board agreed to move forward with plans for a holiday party and monitor CDC recommendations. Several venues were discussed and details will be shared when available. It was announced that a couple more porch parties are planned for Oct 3 & Oct 31. Ideas are also being explored for a neighborhood cocktail hour this fall at a local bar/restaurant.

October Neighborhood Meeting. Agenda was discussed for the Tues, Oct 5 meeting. More details will be shared along with a Zoom link closer to the meeting date but schedules permitting, representatives from city-council, IMPD and the Mayor's office will be in attendance.

Public art/Leah Orr Tribute. A proposal was reviewed with ideas for the triangle median, including the addition of a sculpture dedicated to Leah Orr. The board was in support of the idea but details of what will change with the median are still pending a design/utility review by DPW, which is at least a year out. It was suggested that the board coordinate with the Arts Council when ready to look at options. A discussion was prompted to encourage public art in the neighborhood and look for opportunities where it could be incorporated.

Mayor's Neighborhood Advocate. Sadly, it was announced that Fabio Yataco has left his position in the mayor's office. Fabio was a great resource for our neighborhood and he will be missed! He won't be too far away as he's joining the team at CICF. Information for our new contact will be shared when available.

The More You Know: Recycling Plastics

St. Joseph has a lot of recycling bins set out every other week, so here's a little more insight on how it all works. A resident of Muncie had questions about how much of her recyclables actually get recycled and CNN took on the investigation to find out. (Watch the video.) The Indy Star did a series focused on Republic Services last year with similar findings. Here's the takeaways:

- 1. Having a recycle symbol doesn't mean it's recyclable.
- 2. Plastics 1 & 2 (particularly bottles) are most likely to be recycled. Plastics 3-7 aren't as desirable to purchasers of recycled materials so there is a high chance they will end up in a landfill. Republic Services suggests not putting them in your bin for this reason and encourages the principles of reduce and reuse.
- 3. Some plastic bags are marked for recycling at stores. Take them to the store versus putting them in your bin.
- 4. Do not put anything in the bin that your provider doesn't accept. It doesn't in fact help that item end up in the right place as one might expect!

You can also help minimize litter in the neighborhood by ensuring your bin lid is closed and leaving a couple feet of space between bins set on the street. It helps the trucks pick them up and get everything into the truck more smoothly (per the driver that flagged me down to share the info)! Thanks for doing your part!
