October Neighborhood Meeting

IMPD Reports

Captain Scott Hessong who oversees the downtown district introduced himself to the neighborhood.

Officer Jeff Patterson provided the 30-day crime report.

- There was a gentleman throwing rocks who broke several windows in the 800-block of Delaware. The individual has mental health issues and they are trying to enforce mandatory treatment soon with an arrest warrant charging that he injured someone by hitting them in the head with a rock. So, once they apprehend him (again), they believe he will be taken into custody.
- There was also a fight at Ivy's to which police responded.
- More information is being sought about the shots fired on N Delaware a few weeks ago.

Officer Patterson volunteered to drive by the area affected on Sahm St behind the BP station to check for any homeless encampments and have them removed as a public safety hazard.

Mark G. shared details about neighbor Harold M.'s idea to pay tribute to Leah Orr with public art. Though the triangle median has too many right-of-way restrictions, he will explore other opportunities to bring this idea to fruition.

President's Report - Mark Godley

I'd like to thank several people for their outstanding work on behalf the SIHNA.

Jan Good – our long-time board treasurer who keeps us both compliant and current in maintaining our nonprofit status with the state. Through the years she has been instrumental in supporting neighborhood events like the National Night Out and our annual holiday party.

Mark Sprout – who serves as VP and has done a great job recruiting members of our neighborhood hospitality committee which has done a fantastic job of responding with nearly weekly porch parties through the summer months – a fantastic response to the pandemic.

Ben Langebartels - heads up architectural design review for the neighborhood and provides input to the Indianapolis Historic Preservation Commission on new and renovation construction proposal. We appreciate his deep dives into the St. Joseph Historic Area Plan that provides approved guidance for everything from fences to building design.

Mindy McCutchan - heads up our member communication, including email updates to members and has contributed to a record 60 members in our association. Her contributions include heading up the window clings, writing a grant application to DPW to repair/replace damaged sidewalks in the neighborhood, and working with councilman Adamson and an interneighborhood group resulting in top prioritization for resurfacing the 200 block of St. Joseph St.

Eric Hannon – has been instrumental in profiling our business members in email communications and this has resulted in new business members joining as well as acquainting our membership with neighborhood businesses. We especially thank Tru Reflections Salon for recently hosting a porch party!

Ben Csikos - a board member at large brings a wealth of experience from his work as a school administrator to help advise and select different vendors for use in our various projects.

Finally, we acknowledge Ric Good for his work with the St. Joseph Beautification committee – which recently took on the triangle median at Fort Wayne and St. Clair streets. Ric and his committee's work has inspired others in the neighborhood to adopt blocks with KIB and keep the neighborhood looking much better in between our spring and fall clean-ups.
