Owned/Leased Horse Lessons/Training Information Sheet

Lesson and Training Rates:

Single Lesson/Training session	\$65
*Payment is due at the time of the lesson/school.	
4 Lessons/Training Monthly Package	\$200
8 Lessons/Training Monthly Package	\$360
12 Lessons/Training Monthly Package	\$480
16 Lessons/Training Monthly Package	\$600

Payment is due at the first of every month for prepaid packages listed above.

Should your horse require lunges*, turnouts and/or hand walks, you will be charged for those services separately at a rate less than a normal lesson or training ride.

*The exception to this policy are Pessoa Rig lunging sessions and/or lunging after a period of rain when the arenas are still closed and we have to use the open field in the front of the ranch. These sessions are very labor intensive since so these lunges count as a training session.

Lesson Duration:

Regularly scheduled private lessons include ½ hour of mounted instruction, semi-private (2-3 riders) include 45 minutes of mounted instruction and group lessons (4 or more riders) include 1 hour of mounted instruction. At the instructor's discretion, as in the case of inclement weather (i.e. rain, wind, excessive heat) or issues concerning the well-being/soundness of either the horse or rider, the duration of a lesson may be shortened accordingly.

Missed Lesson Policy:

Missed lessons (except for "No Shows") may be made up at any time in the same calendar month. If riders are not able to get their missed lesson(s) made up in the same calendar month, one (1) Missed Lessons/training session may be carried over to the following month for clients enrolled in a weekly or twice weekly training program. Two (2) missed lessons/training session may be carried over to the following month for clients enrolled in a three or four times weekly training program. Riders must take their makeup lessons or substitute a training ride in addition to their normal pre-paid package. Make-up lessons will be not be allowed during a month that a package is not pre-paid, so riders who suspend or skip a month on their lesson/training package will forfeit their missed lesson(s). 24 hours' notice of cancellation is appreciated so that the trainer has the opportunity to fill the opening created by the cancellation. Riders who "no show" will not be entitled to a makeup lesson. Missed sessions will not be refunded under any circumstance.

Clients may schedule a make-up session:

- 1) On an additional day of the week other than their regularly scheduled lesson day, for mounted or unmounted instruction.
- 2) On the same day as their regularly scheduled lesson - riding a different horse for 2nd lesson or doing some type of unmounted instruction.
- 3) On a school horse should their own horse be laid up.
- 4) By joining a group unmounted horsemanship lessons that will cover a variety of informative horse care and training subjects. Depending on the number of students in attendance, these horsemanship lessons will last 1-2 hours.

Makeup lessons may also be formal or casual instruction. If you would like a bareback lesson or a trail ride instead please let us know! Let us know if there is something specific you would like to learn during a makeup lesson that would not be covered during a typical riding lesson, or perhaps not covered in depth.

Horse Shows:

Coaching fees

Schooling fees

\$35 Schooling fee covers trainer riding horse for warm-ups and/or classes

Horse Use

\$80 if using horse owned by HV, HV client, or Heartland Ranch (fee waived if leasing)

Full Grooming

\$75/day includes grooming, tacking, feeding, medicating, watering, blanketing, stall cleaning, leg wrapping, lunging and/or hand walking. Grooming is paid on all days that horse is at show grounds and under grooms care.

Full Grooming is mandatory for all horses attending multiday/overnight shows.

Single Day Grooming

\$50 includes grooming, tacking, care of horse at the trailer, lunging.

Other fees that may apply

Set up/tear down

\$40/show covers packing and unpacking of supplies, set up and tear down of stalls, tack rooms, grooming and seating area. Clients that assist with set up or tear down may receive a credit/partial credit on this fee.

Load/Unload

\$15/\$30 if owner/rider not present to wrap, load/unload horse and before or after the show.

Basic Rate (\$50 min)

\$25 per hour + \$.85 per mile (round trip)

Basic rate fee is calculated on round trip time & mileage. Includes loading time, time spent at destination, unloading.

Lunging & Hand Walking:

Pessoa Rig/Rain Lunge **\$37.50 - \$50**

Billed as training session so price varies according to your training package

Lunging

*If a client has prepaid for a Training Package, Lunging sessions and hand walks provided will be \$25. Lunging in surcingle/biting rig and lunging days after rain storms in the open field are billed as a training sessions since they are very labor intensive. Clients not signed up for a monthly training package will be charged \$50 for a rain day lunge or surcingle lunge, \$35 regular lunge, \$35 for hand walking.

Turnouts:

Jump Usage Fee:

There is a fee for riders wishing to use the jumps outside of lessons. **Single session payments must be paid on the day you use the jumps.** Riders utilizing the per month/prepaid plan who not being billed on a monthly HVRA statement (i.e. non-clients) **must leave payment before using the jumps.** The billing cycle starts on the 1st of each month. Payment may be left in Amy's office if she is not on property. Riders are responsible for any damage to jumps or jumps cups during this time.

Lunch/Supplements/Medications:

Simple preparation would be feeding grain/pellets/hay. Anything requiring extra preparations such as mixing supplements, medication, grinding or soaking, or if it must be given orally, would be considered complicated preparation.

Trainer Commissions on Outside Lease, Purchases and Sales of Horses:

Ready to look for your own horse? Let us use our combined 50 years of experience in the horse industry to help you find just the right one!! Aside from teaching their clients to ride, trainers also play a vital role assisting clients in finding suitable horses when it comes time to purchase or lease their own. As with many industries (real estate agents for example) you hire a professional for their expertise as well their contacts in that industry - both of which most riders/parents won't have. I came across an article in Practical Horseman magazine that states it well and plainly. *"The purpose of commissions is to reimburse agents (trainers/dealers serving as intermediaries for buyers and sellers) for their time and expertise in helping you select a horse who will suit your goals. Many trainers have devoted years to developing their skills in assessing horses and riders, and they strive to work in good faith for their clients. On a practical note, because trainers generally experience high overhead in the form of staff and facility costs and a low return on the time they spend on lessons and at shows, sales commissions ensure their ability to earn a living"*. Industry standard is anywhere from 10-15%. We charge a 10% commission on the purchase/sale prices or lease fee price of the horse, with a \$500 minimum commission for all sale, purchases or leases. By California Law all commissions over \$500 must be declared and transparent. **Clients will be provided a commission contract and asked pay a \$500 deposit which will be applied toward commission on purchase or lease of horse.** If we negotiate a lease on client owned horse and another client, a flat fee of \$500 will apply, to be split between the 2 parties. When purchasing/leasing a horse it is always best to negotiate a trial period if possible. This gives you the ability to ride the horse on your "home turf" and allows us multiple rides in order to help decide if the horse is suitable. **During this trial period you will be financially responsible for hauling to/from the barn, board/care while the horse is at our facility, and lessons and/or professional rides and a pre-purchase exam.** If the horse does not work out or pass a vet check, which can be disappointing, consider it spending a little to save a lot.

HVRA Full and Half Lease Program –

Leasing is a great opportunity for any level of rider! It allows you to improve your skills (many of which can only be learned by spending extra time in the saddle), expand your horse husbandry experience and spend time loving and caring for a special horse.

It is also a great stepping stone to owning your own horse. It can be the most cost effective way of advancing to the next level, which broaden your choices for the type of horse you can then purchase. Leasing also gives you the experience of owning without the responsibility and expense beyond the lease term, so it is a great way to “test out” you or your child’s level of commitment before purchasing.

It is a terrific option for getting your “horse fix” if horse ownership is simply not in your budget. When leasing a safe, quality horse there are 2 components to the cost: the lease fee and the cost of care. The LEASE FEE is a one-time fee paid to the owner of the horse. This fee varies from horse to horse, depending on their athletic ability, training and demeanor. This fee helps the owner recoup some of the costs from the initial purchase of the horse and its subsequent upkeep.

The COST OF CARE FEE covers the ongoing monthly costs involved in the upkeep of the horse. While most things such as board are a relatively consistent, the cost of shoeing, additional feed/supplements, and routine vet maintenance can vary, so the cost of care will vary slightly from horse to horse.

We have a number of wonderful horses available for lease through the HVRA program.

Leases are Full or Half. A Full Lease entitles you to complete access to the horse as though you own it. A Half Lease entitles you to limited access to the horse - up to 3 days a week.

Additional benefits to Leasing:

- *Reduced rate for lessons.
- *Priority when scheduling lesson times.
- *Use of your lease horse for your lessons.
- *Use of your lease horse for showing.
- *Horse use fee (\$80) is waived at horse shows.

HVRA Horses lease horses

Level 1 horse – This horse is suitable for riders from the walk/trot through crossrail level.

Level 2 horse – This horse is suitable for riders through the 2’0 level.

Level 3 horse - This horse is suitable for riders through the 2’6 level. Level 3 horses are available for full lease only since they can only be asked to jump at that height 2-3 days a week.

Outside Lease horse – Riders wishing to jump/compete at a level higher than 2’6 will need to purchase or lease horse a horse of that caliber. When you are ready to take that step we are here to help.

IF YOU OWN YOUR OWN HORSE AND WOULD LIKE TO CONSIDER LEASING IT PLEASE LET US KNOW.

Your horse can be potentially leased for the same lease fee and shared cost of care listed above. We will help organize a lease with one of our current clients or an outside person for an “onsite” lease (meaning your horse stays here). **There is a flat fee of \$500 for us to facilitate a lease for you.** If the person who leases your horse is a current client, it is not inappropriate for you to ask them to split the fee with you since if we had to go outside the barn to find them a horse they would be paying the same fee or more.
