Owned/Leased Horses Lessons/Training Information Sheet

"Pay as you Go" Single Session Rate

\$85

Available for Students wanting an occasional lesson/schooling session.

LESSON AND TRAINING PACKAGES:

By signing up for a package, clients will save \$20-\$40 per session when compared to the single session rate. Payment is due at the start of the month.

Should your horse require lunges, turnouts and/or hand walks, you will be charged for those services separately at a rate less than a normal lesson or training ride.

Lesson Duration:

Regularly scheduled private lessons include ½ hour of mounted instruction, semi-private (2-3 riders) include 45 minutes of mounted instruction and group lessons (4 or more riders) include 1 hour of mounted instruction. At the instructor's discretion, as in the case of inclement weather (i.e. rain, wind, excessive heat) or issues concerning the well-being/soundness of either the horse or rider, the duration of a lesson may be shortened accordingly or an unmounted horsemanship lesson may be substituted.

Missed Lesson Policy:

We want our clients to get the most out of their training packages! But it takes 5 to 6 hours every week to put together a lesson schedule based on the availability you give us, so last minute cancellations and no shows are very frustrating. Riders who "no show" will not be entitled to a makeup lesson. Riders who have an excessive amount of late cancellations (12 hours or less) may not be entitled to a makeup lesson so keep your late cancellations to no more than 1 if enrolled in 4 or 8 sessions per month; 2 if enrolled in 12 or 16 sessions per month. If late cancellations lead to you having an unfulfilled training package at the end of the month, a lunge (or similar service) performed during the month may be substituted in place of the late cancel missed lesson.

- * The 3 times a week/12 times per month training package is required for clients that:
- 1) want be part of the HVRA show team, especially if they compete over fences
- 2) own a green horse/young horse/naughty horse that needs professional rides to develop it into, or keep it performing as, a useful, solid citizen
- 3) do not have the time to commit keeping their horse in a minimum of 4-5 days a week work program

^{*}Payment is due at the time of the lesson, cash payment only.

^{*}Any waiver to this minimum requirement must be discussed and approved by the HVRA trainers.

supplies purchased during the show season for common use.

Other fees that may apply

a multiday show. Waived if clients provide meals for trainer.

Hotel/Rooming \$ TBD Covers the cost of lodging should the multi-day show be outside of San Diego. Split between the

number of riders at the show.

Commissions, Sales, Leases, Purchases

Trainer Commissions on Outside Lease, Purchases and Sales of Horses:

Ready to look for your own horse? Let us use our combined 40 years of experience in the horse industry to help you find just the right one!! Aside from teaching their clients to ride, trainers also play a vital role assisting clients in finding suitable horses when it comes time to purchase or lease their own. As with many industries (real estate agents for example) you hire a professional for their expertise as well their contacts in that industry - both of which most riders/parents won't have. I came across an article in Practical Horseman magazine that states it well and plainly. "The purpose of commissions is to reimburse agents (trainers/dealers serving as intermediaries for buyers and sellers) for their time and expertise in helping you select a horse who will suit your goals. Many trainers have devoted years to developing their skills in assessing horses and riders, and they strive to work in good faith for their clients. On a practical note, because trainers generally experience high overhead in the form of staff and facility costs and a low return on the time they spend on lessons and at shows, sales commissions ensure their ability to earn a living". Industry standard is anywhere from 10-15%. We charge a 10% commission on the purchase/sale prices or lease fee price of the horse, with a \$750 minimum commission for all sale, purchases or leases. By California Law all commissions over \$500 must be declared and transparent.

Clients will be provided a commission contract and asked pay a \$500 deposit which will be applied toward commission on purchase or lease of horse.

If we negotiate a lease on a current client owned horse and another current client, a flat fee of \$500 will apply, to be split between the 2 parties.

When purchasing/leasing a horse it is always best to negotiate a trial period if possible. This gives you the ability to ride the horse on your "home turf" and allows us multiple rides in order to help decide if the horse is suitable. During this trial period you will be financially responsible for hauling to/from the barn, board/care while the horse is at our facility, and lessons and/or professional rides and a pre-purchase exam. If the horse does not work out or pass a vet check, which can be disappointing, consider it spending a little to save a lot.
