Continuing Education Units:

This Certificate Program consists of 7 Continuing Education Units or a minimum of 70 contact hours of training and clinical supervision that leads to Certificate in Energy Medicine Caring for Animals.

Certificate in Energy Medicine: Caring for Animals

Curriculum: Choose either small or large animals as your focus.

- Part I – Introduction of Energy Medicine Caring for Animals
3 CEU's = 30 contact hours
 - Animal Introductory Seminar = 3 contact hours
 - Energy Medicine Energy Care = 24 contact hours
 - Animal Energy Centers
 - Animal Energy Field
 - Animal Energy Tracts
 - Ethical dimensions = 3 contact hours
- Part II – Experience Applying Energy Medicine with Animals
Includes supervision and feedback 3 CEU's = 30 contact hours
- Part III – Completion of the basic program with a special project or paper.
1 CEU = 10 contact hours



Descriptions

Part I – Basic Introduction of Energy Medicine with Animals

During this course the student will build on his / her personal interest in choosing this work.

Part II – Applying Energy Medicine with Small or Large Animals

This is usually 3 to 6 months depending to the time commitment. It provides experience in working with energy centers, energy field and energy tracts. It can be done on line as well as in person with peers. This includes development of intuition with animals.

Part III – Completion of Certificate with Project or Paper

Practice, study and application are the three cornerstones to this certificate. Depending on the background, interest and time spent each person's study is individualized to meet their personal goal for choosing to studying Energy Medicine: Caring for Animals.
