I've never rehearsed a show quite like this before and I'd guess most of you haven't, either. We may find ourselves quarantining again. In that case, I hope we will be able to make the rehearsal process enough fun to be worth participating in on its own- I know I, for one, just miss the process of putting a play together!

If you feel safe and comfortable auditioning for the show, I'd love to see a video of what you can do! I'll be publishing audition sides for video auditions, and anyone who cannot record their audition should feel free to reach out to me- I can Zoom you directly or we can work out a socially distanced in person audition.
