

SPARK Lesson Plan: The Power of Music and Friendship

Situation (Real-World Connection & Objectives)

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the role of music in emotional expression and social connection.
- Explore the life and contributions of Johann Sebastian Bach and his family, focusing on the significance of fugues in music.
- Develop empathy and awareness of the challenges faced by individuals with autism.

Real-World Applications:

Problem (Authentic Challenge)

Challenge:

William discovers a passion for music and friendship through the tune of Bach's Little Fugue in G minor. However, he struggles with loneliness and social interactions.

Students will develop a community initiative that promotes music as a means of connection for students who may feel lonely or isolated. They will research local music programs, identify potential collaborators (e.g., music shops, local musicians), and propose an event that brings people together through music.

Considerations:

- How can music be used to create an inclusive environment for all students?
- What resources are available in the community to support this initiative?
- How might different musical genres or styles appeal to various groups?

Aspirations (Student-Centered Goals & Action Plan)

Goals:

Action Plan:

1. **Research Phase:**
