Last year, recipients included SHIP, Agape House, Franklin Food Bank, Center for Great Expectations, Mary Mother of God, and Immaculate Conception.

DONATE NON-PERISHABLE FOOD:

Our standard baskets contain: Stove Top stuffing, cranberry jelly, boxes of Jello, canned vegetables (green beans, corn, etc.), and canned gravy. Of course, all types of canned goods or non-perishable food are appreciated.

DONATE FROZEN TURKEYS

Every basket starts with a turkey. Storage space is not available, We are working through alternative Drop Off Plans so please stay tuned.

We do purchase the turkeys and food for approximately 50 baskets. Your monetary donations assist us in defraying the cost and increasing the number of baskets we deliver.
