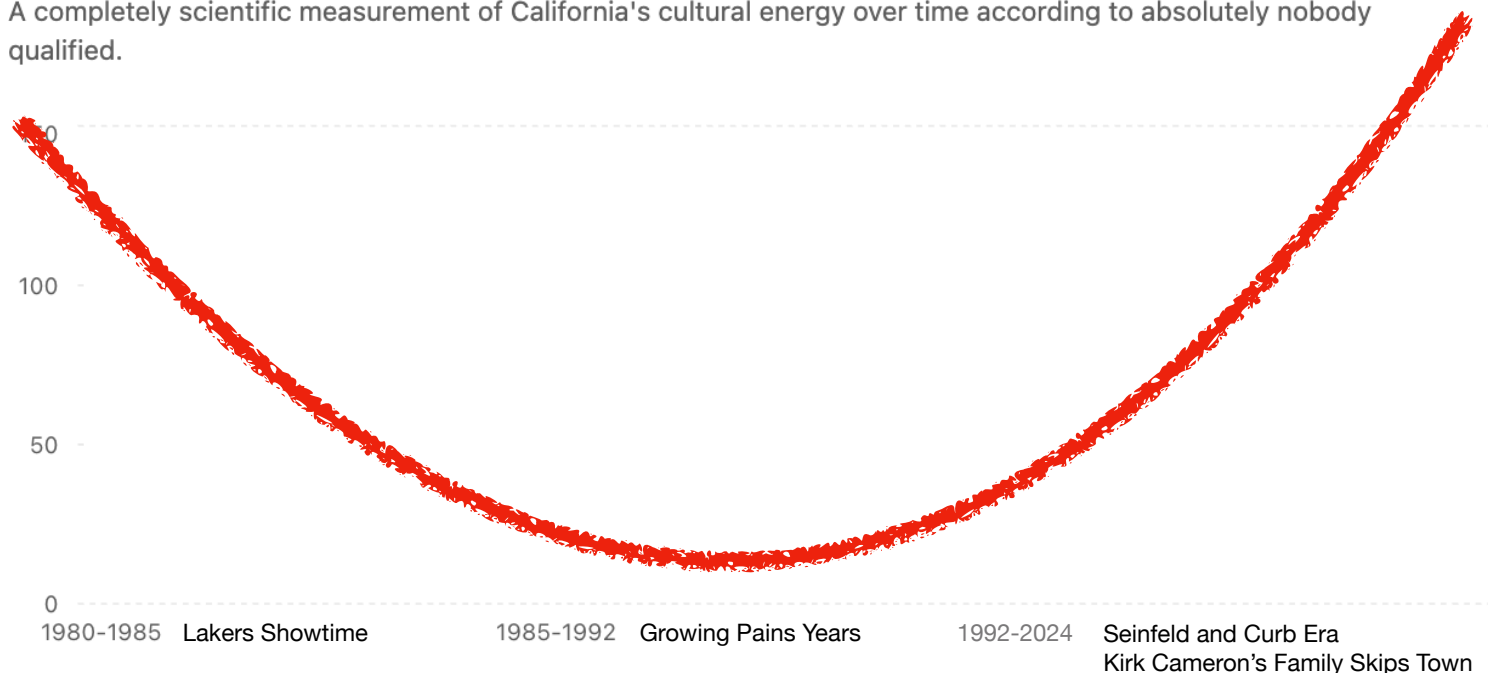
With other defections from marginal celebrities, California points to a new report claiming the state has actually become “88% funnier” since Joe Rogan and several other “comedians” relocated.
