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



John-Herbert Wright


From the tender age of eight, Wright gravitated to painting as an escape expressing a rich inner world. His work heavily relies upon dark figurations amongst an urban landscape leaving the viewer space to navigate the world he creates. An analogy of the human condition; centering the female nude/mother and child as the protagonist, he tells the story of the broken seeking respite, the downcast, the other. Wright seeks to illuminate the universe of darkness within all of us, within himself, and that darkness contrasted with fragility has always been at the epicenter of his work.

Wright has managed to create a niche for himself as a painter and street-wear designer, contributing to the role the graphic t-shirt played in disseminating New York street culture across the globe. Transferring the techniques of garment making onto his canvases, Wright's paintings feature backdrops of multiple layers of silk-screened images, drawings and text. Although his success has been celebrated, in many ways till now, Wright has also kept his own story on fade.

Rewind & Reflect debuts John-Herbert Wright, the next chapter in the artists' journey. For his solo premiere, Wright explores the theme of abstract figurations in nine new paintings reflecting an intimate expression of his own personal story narrated through the music that has provided the soundtrack to his life.

In the new collection, the artist reflects on the evolution of fatherhood across multigenerations, silkscreening personal photographs from his childhood and family history to weave his story, highlighting relationships between himself, his father and grandfather. His own challenges with violence and mental health, understanding and embracing his own unique multi-racial, multi-ethnic identity, with roots spanning from the Philippines to Harlem ca. 1950s.

Each painting is titled after a song that has impacted the artist. From his father's favorite musicians like James Taylor and Simon & Garfunkel to his own contemporary heroes like Nipsey Hussle and Juice Wrld, the music serves as a creative bridge if you will between his abstract streams of consciousness and the world at large. The collection celebrates everything that has brought the artist from standing behind the hat as Mr. John Wright to standing tall as John-Herbert Wright, the painter willing to not only craft but curate and celebrate his past and all of its beauty and bruises through this show.

Sade's 1984 classic "Smooth Operator" has been a song that resonated with Wright for numerous reasons. Besides his personal admiration for the track and the beauty of the band's lead singer Helen Folasade Adu, the term rather appropriately refers to his grandfather, Herbert. Wright's father was the unexpected result of his black grandfather's affair with a white woman. This painting was the first piece Wright explored as part of the Rewind & Reflect collection. Understanding his grandfather and the two women he had as grandmothers is a chapter of Wright's family story he never discussed as openly, until now.

Mazzy Star's "Fade Into You" in many ways encompassed Wright's adolescence. Tumultuous and often filled with angst, sadness and feelings of extreme pain and loss, Wright unmasks the challenges of fighting for love and chasing the belief that sometimes passion can immerse one so deeply that you can lose yourself. From the inside it feels sacred but from the outside, it's far from that – leading to a feeling of isolation that can only be saved by addiction.

Of course no redemption is easy and even when things seem to be improving, there can be moments of darkness. Wright's dreams were just that "Lucid Dreams" as Juice WRLD expressed. Of course, they would be fueled by a suicidal ideation that longed for "The Sound Of Silence" as detailed by Simon & Garfunkel. For Wright, his dreams bridged the gap between his past and what his future could have been. The appreciation for the darkness by shining a light on it through his art has carried Wright to his latest chapter as an artist.







Bio

Mekia Machine is a Jamaican-born artist who was raised in the USA for much of her life; she has a multidisciplinary practice that ranges across painting, sound, music and performance. Her work investigates aesthetic and societal norms through conceptions of time, identity, memory, and place, specifically in cultures where loss and trauma is a substantial part of daily life. In addition to exhibiting, Machine was one of the winners of This Art is Your Art, 2016 with Artsy, The Robert Rauschenberg Foundation and the White House Historical Association, for her short film on painting artist Alma Thomas's portrait which was part of a 4-month installation and she was invited to join First Lady Michelle Obama at the Celebration of 20th Century Art in the White House. Additionally, Machine was awarded the fully funded Liquitex | Just Imagine Residency in 2021. Mekia graduated from Columbia University with a BA in Visual Arts (2019), and is currently living and working in Harlem, New York City, with her two children Taylor and Nola






Dead Lovers is a series of paintings consisting of a single image, the headless body of a woman wading in water. In actuality it is of a naked swimmer photographed from below, head above water. The image, at first glance, triggered memories and questions of the death of my childhood best-friend and first love. What happened to her body? She drowned 23 years ago trying to come to America illegally. Compositionally, each painting represents a snapshot of memories at once, reading like the pattern of my habitual rumination--a single issue or thought reexamined to no end in my mind. The overlapping and falling, floating and dissipating of the body is the awful question I ask inwardly, of how did it happen? How did she fall? Where is she now? How does it look? What happened to her body? I was 11 years old when I saw her last before migrating to the US. I don't remember her face enough to paint it. However, I remember her body and how it felt, so drawing on a memory of a feeling, and my increasing obsession with painting dead people-- family, friends, ancestors who've died leaving no photographic evidence of their existence, over time an image emerges in my mind, at times triggered by a portrait. Allowing myself to sit with these painful thoughts of her brutal death contrasted with memories of a simple yet colorful life as island girls, I could finally mourn her. This series is an attempt to resurrect and spend time with an old friend as we did as kids.
